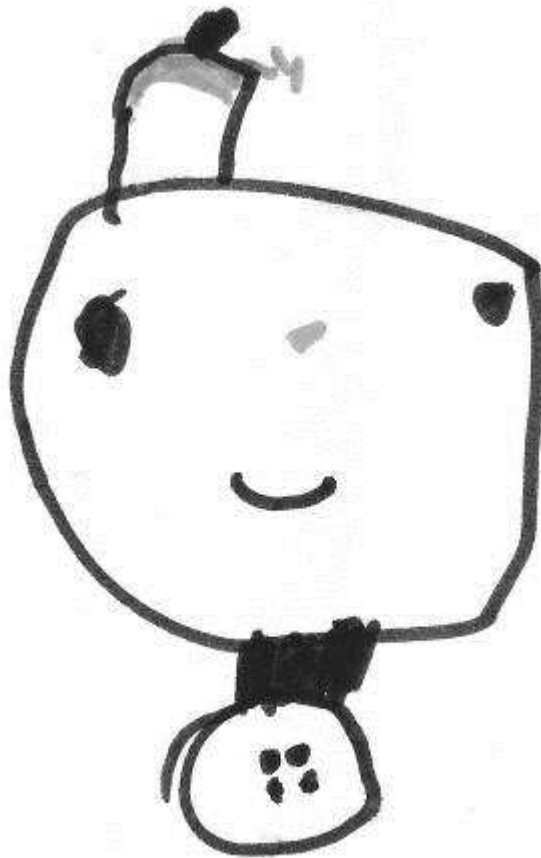

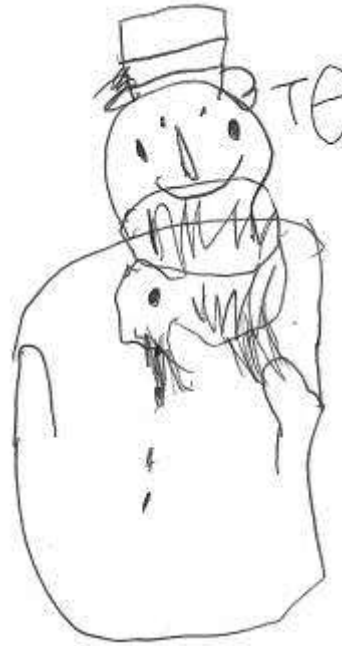

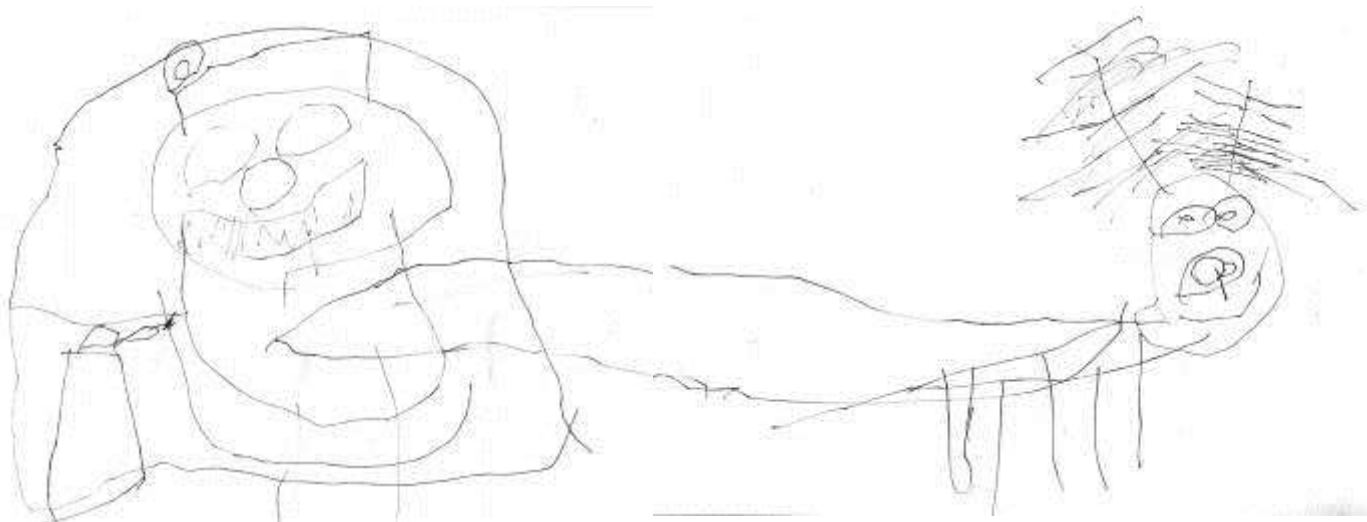

FROM THE BISHOP OF TAUNTON

Open our eyes, Lord

I am aware that I am writing this letter in the aftermath of the awful motorway crash on the M5 over the first weekend of November. I am also conscious that this letter will be read as we prepare to celebrate the joy of the Christ child. Christmas invites us to celebrate the presence of God in this world of His, but often it only serves to highlight for many people the sadness and grief, the pain and the hurt that they are currently going through.

Those two realities seem to be in stark contrast to one another, until we look more deeply into the context in which God chose to make his home with us. We are reminded in Luke's gospel that Jesus was born under the reign of Caesar Augustus. He was born under Roman oppression, evidenced by the forced registration with which Mary and Joseph, like all the citizens of Galilee, were required to comply.

As well as that, the familiarity of the season's festivities should not prevent us from realising the scandal that God came into human history completely helpless, as a newborn, and was laid in a feeding trough. He slipped almost unnoticed into a small province, far from the seat of power. Born to a young couple, unwed or only recently married. God was born on the road, and those who first visited him were shepherds, the often despised ones, and not kings.

So this birth that we prepare for is one which identifies God with those who are literally 'going through it'. In the harsh reality of their experience and our experience, God dares to offer the gift of hope and new life. I use this Iona Prayer to get ready for Christmas. I hope you might also find it helpful.

Open our eyes, Lord, especially if they are half shut because we are tired of looking, or half open because we fear to see too much, or bleared with tears because yesterday and today and tomorrow are filled with the same pain, or contracted because we only see what we want to see!

Open our eyes, Lord, to gently scan the life we lead, the home we have, the world we inhabit, and so to find among the gremlins and the greyness, signs of hope we can fasten on and encourage. Give us, whose eyes are dimmed by familiarity, a bigger vision of what you can do even with hopeless cases and lost causes and people of limited ability.

Show us the world as in your sight, riddled by debt, deceit, and disbelief, yet also shot through with possibility for recovery, renewal, redemption. And, lest we fail to distinguish vision from fantasy, today, tomorrow, this week, open our eyes to one person, one place, where we, being even for a moment prophetic, might identify and encourage a potential in the waiting.

And with all this, open our eyes in longing, for Jesus - on the hills, in the valleys, in the cities, in the villages, through the corridors of power and the streets of despair, to help, to heal, to confront, to convert. 'O come, O come Emmanuel!'

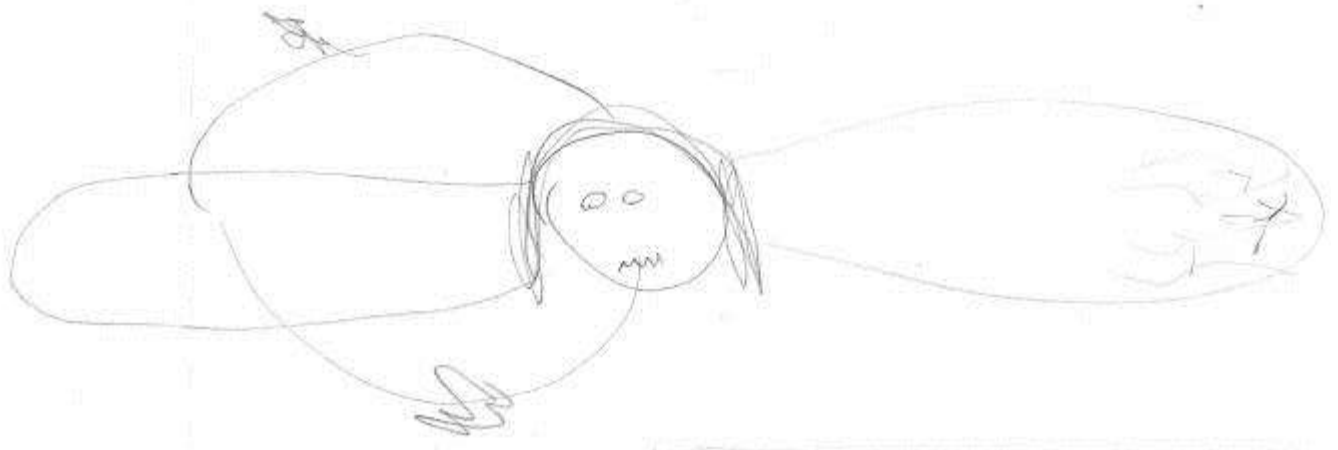

FROM THE RECTORY

The Church has been in the headlines nationally over the last few weeks. The Occupy London demonstrations have not so much shone light on the greed of our present financial structure as on the morals, ethics and inner workings of the Church of England. Or have they?

Most people outside the C of E assume it is some kind of monolithic structure and the Archbishop of Canterbury our home grown version of the Pope. Nothing could be farther from the truth. One of the strands that caused the break away from the Roman Catholic Church was the British dislike of having anyone tell them what to do. So the Church structure that we created for ourselves was one where a set of rules and norms that everyone had to abide by was put in place but, within those rules, we were all kings in our own castles. No-one can tell the Rector and Church Council how to run the local church, no-one can tell the Dean of St Paul's and the Cathedral Chapter how to run St Paul's and the Archbishop of Canterbury cannot tell the Bishop of London how to conduct himself. A recipe for chaos? Perhaps. But what it means is that the Church of England isn't one organization run from Canterbury but a family of Christians all trying to work out what their faith requires of them in the specific set of circumstances they happen to find themselves in. When confronted with the demonstrators (some of whom are also "C of E") on the steps of St Paul's, the clergy had to weigh up the ethical and moral demands of the Christian faith with the advice they were getting from their in-house health and safety people and the need for St Paul's to pay its bills with everyone keeping a weather eye on the possible litigation should anything go wrong. A mess? Yes. But an honest mess played out in the full glare of publicity that mirrors the complex decision making we all less publicly partake in.

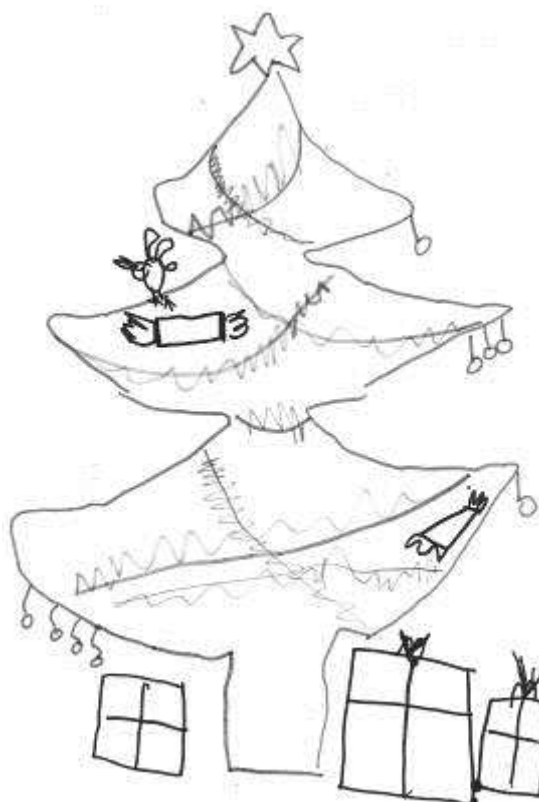
No doubt, with the benefit of hindsight, people might have acted differently and certainly, more tidily. But that's the thing about life, it cannot be rewound. The clergy at St Paul's didn't "get it right", whatever that might have meant, but they got it wrong honourably and, sometimes, that is the best we can hope for. **Jo**

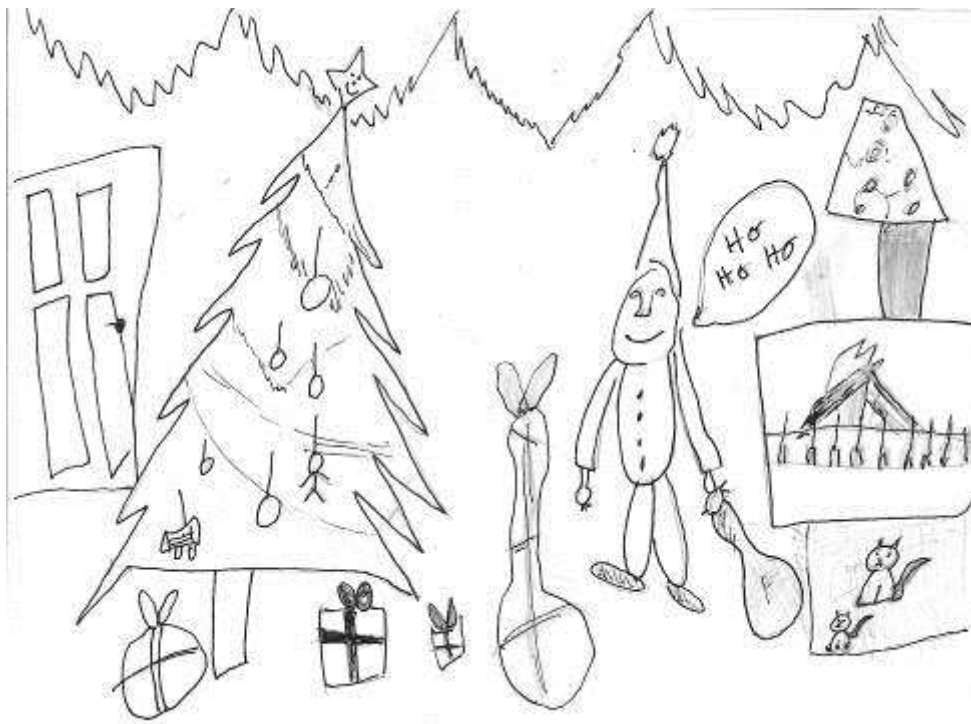
