FROM THE RECTORY

The big event nationally in April was the royal wedding: the big event in our three parishes in June is the Summer Fair!

This year it's being held at the excellent new hall at Charlton Musgrove. There will be plenty of mention of time and date later in the magazine so I won't do any advertising here. I thought I would explain why we have such a thing. Obviously, a big part of it is enjoyment, so that, we hope, a good time may be had by all but it wouldn't be honest if I didn't also mention.....THE MONEY.

Why is the Church always asking for money? An understandable refrain I have often heard in the past so I thought I would explain why our three parishes sometimes ask for your money.

The Church of England, of which this benefice is a part, is a countrywide network of people and buildings dedicated to the worship of God and the service of the community. Sunday by Sunday, people across England gather in their local churches to pray and to give thanks and weekday by weekday, they do their best to live out their faith. Have you ever wondered who pays for the upkeep of the Church and who pays for the upkeep of the clergy? It's simple: the parishioners do!

Our local congregations are responsible for paying every bill the church incurs, insurance, heating, lighting, all the normal sorts of bills we all pay at home. Also, local congregations are responsible for finding the money for every piece of repair and restoration, whether big or small that the Church building or its contents, like bells and organs, might need, to make sure our churches are there for the next generation. Added to that, our local congregations have to pay their share of what it costs to have a Vicar or a share of a Vicar in every parish. Many Vicars are paid and housed, although quite a number give their time at their own cost and all of them paid or unpaid, have to be trained and all of that costs money. This year, our benefice will be paying about £24,000 to pay towards the costs of the Vicars in our diocese and that's on top of the bills for our local church.

I am not asking for your money. Times are hard for everyone and I am grateful for all the support you have shown in the past and I thank you for your generosity of money, time and energy. This isn't an Appeal, simply an explanation of why we will keep on needing your help and why it is we organize fund raising events like the Summer Fair. We hope for good Somerset sunshine and fun for everyone (including our dogs this year!!) but we also hope it will help us just keep paying the bills.

FROM THE BISHOP OF TAUNTON

Small acts of kindness and generosity keep God's kingdom growing

Just before Easter I found myself as the 'castaway' on a version of Desert Island Discs in Ilminster. I was surprised by how much I enjoyed the experience and I was delighted that my rather bizarre choice of records, which included Adam Faith and Dusty Springfield, struck a chord with so many of the listeners – it must be my age!

I was reminded of the evening because I have just received a 'thank you' letter from the charity that I wanted to support that evening, 'Kid's Company' and with it a gift of a wonderfully colourful tie made by one of the vulnerable young people who are helped by it. The founder is an inspirational Iranian woman called Camilla Batmanghelidjh. Kid's Company, based in Inner City Peckham, supports kids whom many others have given up on, and by offering them a place of safety and welcome, lives are often turned around.

'One of our street boys', writes Camilla, 'who came in the early days and drove me crazy is now an ambulance driver and is working as a gang mediator trying to prevent shootings in the streets. One of our girls who arrived homeless aged 16 just got a 2:1 at Oxford in experimental psychology. Your friendship for our vulnerable children will always be treasured.' In fact we raised just over £450. It doesn't sound much, but then it is often the small acts of generosity and kindness that make all the difference.

I spent the week after Easter in Normandy and visited the town of Lisieux, now famous as the place where St Therèse lived as a Carmelite Nun. Therèse lived only a short time. She never went on missions; she never founded a religious order; she never performed great works and it is only her written journal, 'The Story of a Soul' that the church has to remember her by, and yet, within a relatively short time, the Catholic Church made her a saint. Why?

Because she was a reminder to those of us who can feel that we can do so little to make a difference in the world, that it is the small acts of kindness and generosity that keep God's kingdom growing. When Henry James was saying goodbye to his young nephew Billy, he said something the boy never forgot. 'There are three things that are important in human life. The first is to be kind; the second is to be kind; the third is to be kind.'

Annual Parish Meeting and Annual Meeting of the Parish Council was held on 12th May. Councillors present: E Parsons, M Dixon, B Jackson, N Linsley, R Perry, A Watson. C/Cllr A Groskop (SCC), Cllr M Beech (SSDC), R Keep (Clerk) and 1 member of the public. Annual Parish Meeting: in his report Chairman highlighted events during the year: 17 planning applications; new wayside seat installed and dedicated to Mr Pady Yateman for his long service to the Parish Council; thanks due to Mr & Mrs Giles for organizing an alfresco party to celebrate the Royal Wedding; speed indicator device operated four times in a continuing attempt to reduce speeding through Bayford. He concluded by thanking the Parish Councillors, local County and District Councillors and the Clerk for their efforts throughout the year. Mr Jackson reported that 5 couples and 8 single people had been given contributions from the Stoke Trister Charities fund.
