Harvest is a chance to thank and praise God for all his gifts of food, weather and especially the plants which mature in autumn and nourish us all year. The Bible states that the earth is the Lord's and that God is the generous author of summer, winter, spring-time and harvest. Praising God reminds us of our dependence on Him and develops gratitude for all He provides.

Harvest thanksgiving also helps us appreciate the huge debt that we owe to our farmers who are often taken for granted by many who have become emotionally and practically detached from the source of our food. We also have a beautiful landscape in this country, shaped by centuries of farmers producing food for urban populations. We eat because of them, we enjoy our rural environment because of them and we marvel at nature partly because of their work. We need to ensure our farmers are confident, treasured and well supported in society.

Harvest thanksgiving also invites us to express our gratitude practically by sharing what we have. 2.3 billion people don't have anywhere safe and hygienic to go to the toilet and almost 1,000 children die every day from preventable diseases linked to

dirty water and unsafe toilets (UN). The lack of a loo also makes women and girls a target for sexual attack when they go to the toilet in the open, late at night.

So what can we do? Toilet Twinning offers us the chance to twin our loos at home by providing loos for those overseas. This Harvest, join us in thanking God for all He has given us and for our farmers. And let your gratitude spill over by providing others with the loos and sanitation that we take for granted. 

QUINQUENNIAL

We are required to have our church inspected by an architect every 5 years. Our latest inspection was earlier this year. You may have spotted that the cupola has been refurbished and repainted. Some of the tiles on the roof have had to be replaced. Work has also been done inside the church - the rusting metalwork around the windows has been largely replaced. Various of the large wall plaques still need to be re-affixed and refurbished, and some work is needed to stop one of the outside chest tombs from crumbling. The work should all be completed in a month or so. Needless to say, this all costs a substantial amount of money.

PLEASE HELP TO SAVE THE FUTURE OF THE CAT BUS

The CAT bus is a charity struggling to secure funding to safe-guard the future of the service.

Many people are under the misconception that we are funded by SSDC and that they will support us. Historically they have been able to help financially but with all their budget cuts this is no longer available. While they are still very pro the CAT bus, funding has now almost ceased.

For a few years we were supported by funding by the National Lottery; unfortunately, the last bid was unsuccessful resulting in a large deficit in our annual income.

Many of the funding opportunities are geared towards projects with specific criteria that we as transport providers are unable to fit into. People offering this funding often overlook the need for transport in rural areas to enable people to access these projects.

Local parish councils have now included the CAT bus on their precepts which provides a much-needed increase in income. We have increased the fares but, do not want to put the fares out of reach of people who are on a low income, we have also increased the membership but again want to keep it affordable for all.

For many of the people who use the CAT bus it is a life line, enabling them to live independently for longer, giving them a means to socialise and access groups and amenities as well as attend hospital and doctor appointments.

We need to remember that one day, possibly in the not too distant future we or our parents may need this service and if we lose it now it will not be here for us/them.

We are appealing to any business or individual who may be able to offer some financial support either a one-off donation or ongoing sponsorship to get in touch. We are also registered with Gift Aid so if you are a tax payer we are able to claim an extra 25% in addition to what you donate if you fill in our form available from the office or you can download a copy from our website details below.




