What a poignant celebration of a life we were rewarded with and what an insight into a close and loving family.





The Udder Point Of View

From Church Farm Dairy

Hi 128 again, to quote a Cliff Richard song, We're all going on a summer holiday, No more workin' for a week or two ...

This may sound a bit strange, but, like you, we need to have a rest for a period each year. This is called our dry period and it will last about eight weeks which may seem a long holiday. But we have all been milking (working) since our last calf was born, every day producing fresh milk.

But before we have our holiday or rest, there are a few things that have to be done. To start with, we all have a pedicure to make sure that our hooves are in good condition and the correct shape so that we walk correctly. Then, while we are on holiday, our feet have time to correct themselves before we come back onto the yards. Our feet are very important to us because if we are lame and can't walk very well it limits our movements when we are out in the fields eating the nice fresh grass that is grown for us.

As I mentioned, our holiday period is called our dry period due to us not producing milk. The next procedure on the last day we are milked is we have an infusion into our teats. This can be either a small amount of antibiotic to kill off any harmful bugs in our udder to ensure we don't get mastitis in our next lactation (hopefully), or else we get a teat sealant which plugs up the teat canal to make sure no bugs or bacteria enter our udder whilst we are dry. They know which ones of us to treat with what, as our milk is tested regularly for somatic cells/ml of milk which shows how healthy our udders are. Those of us with a higher cell count get treated with antibiotic, the rest with a teat sealant.

The last treatment before we are off is to put a white liquid on our back to try and repel the flies that pester us when we are out in the fields. It's like the Frontline that cats and dogs have to stop pesky things annoying them.

So once we have had all these procedures done, we are off to a field near you, hopefully looking out over the Blackmore Vale, the "Vale of the Little Dairies" on the sunny side of the village.

May see you at the Cucklington Harvest Celebration at Church Farm Dairy on the 19th September with a Ploughman's lunch afterwards, with Wyke Farm's cheese made from our milk.

And there may be a little 128 by then for you to see.
