Autumn thanksgiving for harvests in Britain has ancient origins way before the Harvest Festival tradition begun in Victorian times by the Rev Hawker. The word 'harvest' comes from the Old English word 'Haerfest' meaning 'Autumn' and dates back to pagan times.

But recent neuroscience suggests that we need to find an excuse to give thanks every day, not just once a year! It turns out that gratitude, or a state of thankfulness, has been called the healthiest of all human emotions with a very powerful affect over our lives.

For example, gratitude improves mental and physical well-being as it triggers our brain to release dopamine and serotonin, the neurotransmitters responsible for making us feel good. Gratitude also forms new neural connections to the bliss centre of our brains, improves sleep and reduces fear and anxiety by regulating stress hormones and therefore the experience of pain.

As a result, gratitude has been described as a 'natural antidepressant' as the effects of gratitude, when practiced daily, can be almost the same as medications. By consciously being grateful, science suggests that neural pathways are strengthened to ultimately create a permanent grateful and positive nature within ourselves.

This is why the Bible is stuffed full of references to being grateful and giving thanks! For example,

"Always be joyful, make your life a prayer and give thanks in all circumstances for this is God's perfect plan for you in Christ Jesus". 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18

God wants us to be happy, at peace, hopeful and resourced to cope with all that life presents. Science is now explaining what the Bible has taught from ancient times - that is not happiness that brings us gratitude - it is gratitude that brings us happiness!

7pm, Friday 22 October Arthur Morison Memorial Hall, Cucklington







UDDER FARM NEWS

Monday the 13th of September started of for us girls in the milking herd as usual, we were woken up by the quad bike roaring down the track to our paddock, with a bright light scanning the field to see where we were when it came through the gate. We then got up and slowly meandered back to the yard to be milked. The few of us that had calved over the weekend waited noisily by the gate to our calves' pens, when the quad bike arrived back in the yard they were put in with their young to feed.

We were then milked as usual and let out into the main yard, where there was still some food left in the feed troughs from the night before, at this time of year we can eat the grass quicker than it grows, so we have our appetites fulfilled with the silage that has been made in the summer months. When we had all been milked and were waiting to go back out into our paddock, we heard some more of our friends being turned into the yard, they were coming back from their summer holiday as they are due to calve shortly.

Then we saw HIM, he had been hiding in a field with some of the dry cows, who was HE. HE is our new Aberdeen Angus bull, less plastic arm length gloves this year, his pedigree name is Kingston Vandyke. We were all very excited and all tried to have a look at this new male in our lives.

We spent the rest of the day trying to decide what we were going to call him as Kingston Vandyke was a bit of a mouthful, we thought of Bruce because of his Scottish connections, then we thought about Dick after Dick Van Dyke who was in the film Mary Poppins (in which Julie Andrews won her first Oscar), so from now on he will be called Dick by some and Bruce by some, we expect they will call him bull. After all that excitement we all had a feed and laid down on the grass and chewed our cud.

The other exciting happening this month is that the tractors have been out busy again, this time they have been ploughing one of our grazing fields, so that it can be reseeded with a new ley for us to graze next year. It not only contains different grass varieties, it also contains clover, sainfoin and lucerne, plus other herbs, which will fix nitrogen in the soil to help the grasses grow without the use of inorganic fertilizer.

SLOE GIN



Prick each fruit of 12oz of Sloes 4 times with a darning needle and put in a 2 pint preserving jar.

Add 6oz sugar and 1 pint gin, make sure the lid is tight shut and shake.

Put the jar in a cool dark place and shake two or three times a week for two months.

Leave undisturbed for 6 months.

Strain the liquid and store for a further 6 months.
