EMMANUEL

The Lord himself will give you a sign: The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and will call him Immanuel which means 'God is with us'.

Isaiah 7:14

800 years later, after a very long pregnancy, these amazing words by the prophet Isaiah came to pass. He announces that God will start a whole new relationship with humanity, taking on human form Himself as "Emmanuel" meaning "God is with us".

"God is with us" is such a beautiful definition of Jesus, true God wanting to be with us in the form of true man, the mystery of the incarnation. He is in us all and waits for us to partner with His plan to transform the world with light and love.

So do join us in celebrating *Emmanuel* this Christmas! It is extraordinary that, despite our frail humanity, God has chosen to dwell in us and with us! I pray that we would all have fresh, renewing encounters with His love this Christmas!

TRUFFLED MUSHROOM PATE.

Serves 6

50g dried porcini mushroom
2 tbsp butter
3 shallots, finely chopped
250g chestnut mushrooms, finely chopped
2 garlic cloves, crushed
250g mascarpone
1/2 tbsp white wine vinegar
30g parmesan (or veggie alternative) finely grated
3 tbsp truffle oil

For the topping
100g salted butter
2 tbsp truffle oil
3 thyme sprigs
1/2 tsp green peppercorns, crushed
1/2 tsp pink peppercorns, crushed

Toast, to serve



1. Put the porcini mushrooms in a bowl and pour boiling water over them. Leave to soak for 10 mins.
2. Melt the butter in a frying pan until foaming and fry the shallots over a low heat for 10 mins or until softened and translucent. Add the chestnut mushrooms and fry for 8 mins.
3. Drain (freeze the liquid as delicious as stock or for risotto!) and finely chop the porcini mushrooms, then add to the pan, frying for another 5 mins. Add the garlic and cook for 1 min. Set aside and cool for 20 mins.
4. Tip the mushroom mixture into a food processor along with the mascarpone, vinegar, parmesan and seasoning. Blitz until smooth while drizzling in the truffle oil. Divide between six ramekins.
5. For the topping, melt the butter in a small pan. When the milk solids separate and sink to the bottom, pour the clarified butter into a jug. Mix with the truffle oil and pour over each ramekin.
6. Sprinkle with the thyme and peppercorns and chill for at least 5 hours. Serve with toast if you like.

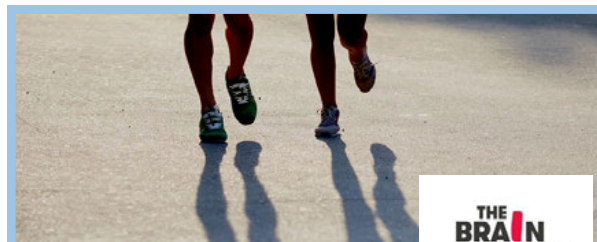
VILLAGES' WALKING GROUP

UDDER FARM NEWS

Hello its 247 this time, you may remember me I wrote about when we were going to go out in the spring after our winter lockdown ended. I was also the first of the heifers to calve this year and there was a picture of me and my baby calf. So I thought I would let you know what has happened to us since, she was born.

As was stated in the September addition I told you she was going to be known as 501, and still is. Well after she was born and we were brought into the yard after a few days of being together she went into another shed where there is the surrogate mother, computerised milk feeding machine, which is very good for her and also very good for me as she isn't trying to suck my udder and butting me all day. She also shares the shed with her cousins, about fifty of them, in varying colours of brown, black and white, depending on the colour of their father. They have now all been weaned off of the milk they were having and are now having silage mixed with a blend of concentrates, just like us older girls. They will stay on that diet until they are allowed out in the spring.

As for us older girls we are all now in total lockdown until the spring, so the winter routine is now happening. This seems to involve a lot of arm length plastic gloves, to start with the vets come and check that we are alright after our calves have been born, then another one appears when we are inseminated. In between times they cover our tail head with paint, which changes every three weeks, fluorescent pink followed by fluorescent yellow and now we have got a nice shade of blue. (The same colours as you see on M.A.M.I.L's, middle aged men in lycra on their bicycles.) The reason for this is to see when we are ready to be inseminated, because if we are ready, we stand still if another cow jumps on our back, which rubs the paint off. Clever technology. Bruce/Dick is running with the younger girls, who have all been inseminated once just to make sure they are in calf, later on he will be running with us, can't wait.

The other exciting thing to happen recently is there have been several new mixer wagons on the back of the tractor to mix up our food and deposit it in the troughs for us to eat, we think they are going to replace the green one that has been here for years, there appears to be holes in the bottom of the old one, as some of the goodies we should be eating fall out onto the ground, so we loose out. We will have to wait and see. When they were here they seemed to chop the long stringy bales up a lot better, which made eating them a lot easier, before it was like sucking in spaghetti.
