# Candlemas Day (the Christian Festival of Lights)

The short cold month of February starts with a beautiful, ancient festival on February 2nd marking the mid point of winter, halfway between the shortest day and the spring equinox. It's the traditional Christian feast commemorating Jesus being taken to the Temple aged 40 days old, to be presented to God by his thankful parents. During their time in the temple, Simeon gave his famous prophecy about Jesus being a light to the Gentile nations and a sign to the Jews, now Nunc Dimittis and read during Evensong.

From this Scripture, a ritual developed of blessing candles which were seen as a symbol of Christ whose birth illumined the world's darkness, the beeswax representing his body, the wick his soul and the flame his divinity. Signifying the time to take down Christmas decorations remembering Christ's birth, it's focus now was on His purpose - to lighten up the darkness.

St Lawrence Cucklington will be filled with candlelight on the evening of Saturday February 5th as local organist, Simon Bending plays a variety of dramatic organ pieces. There'll be feasting too, with wine and nibbles, all to raise money for 8 million people on the brink of famine in Afghanistan and the ancient church. Doors open at 6.30pm - do join us!

# ARE YOU ON ST LAWRENCE, CUCKLINGTON'S ELECTORAL ROLL?

# WHAT IS THE ELECTORAL ROLL?

The church's Electoral Roll is the register of its voting members; it is a list of those qualified to attend and to vote at the Annual Parochial Church Meeting. Electoral rolls provide an indication of the real membership and strength of the church.

# ARE YOU NEW TO THE AREA?

If so, you might want to join. If you were on it last year, you don't need to reapply.

## WHO CAN BE ONTHE ELECTORAL ROLL?

Baptised adults (over 16 years) who live in the parish, or who have worshipped regularly at the church for at lest six months (or who would have attended had sickness not prevented them) who are committed to being part of the life of the local Church of England congregation.

WHY JOIN?

Enrolment is a way of saying "I belong." It is an act of commitment to the local church and to the church as a whole. It opens the way for a greater involvement in the life of the church at parish, deanery, diocesan and national levels.

If you meet the requirement and would like to be on the Electoral Roll, please collect a form from St Lawrence's porch or contact Julia on 01747 841045 for a copy. Please return completed form to the box in the church porch.

# **UDDER FARM NEWS**

Hi it's 214 this month, you may remember me as I wrote a bit last December, (2020). I am the old girl that has just past her 10<sup>th</sup> birthday, I had a senior moment last year and forgot to write the January bit, so I got in early this year before those young ones got their hooves into action.

Well what a year we have had, it started off with us getting out of our winter lockdown reasonably early on the  $1^{\rm st}$ 

March and we had some really tasty grass and also into April, but we didn't get the April showers that we normally get, that is not until May when it didn't stop raining. This resulted in grass growth slowing down in April for us to eat, and also the grass for silage was slow to get going, so silage making was late this year and do we know it, as the silage is not as good quality as we expect them to make. I think I herd them saying that they had never made first cut silage in June before. But after that things evened themselves out and we had plenty of grass to eat for the rest of the year, and longingly looking over the gate at the moment it doesn't seemed to have stopped growing, so hopefully we will be able to get out early again this year. It got wet again in October so they had us in at night, so we didn't have to stay out huddling under the hedge. Then came November when we were all inside and it stopped raining and was nearly the driest month of the year, typical!

Now we are just waiting to get out in the fields again as this time of year is boring for us, we get woken up, then we are milked, fed and then milked again.

We have herd that the new mixer feed wagon is due very shortly so we will have a bit of difference to our routine as its red not green and it goes from the top of the yard to the bottom, unlike the previous one that went from bottom to top, its so exciting at this time of year. But like most things at the moment not all of it has been delivered to the dealer, so we will have half a new mixer feed wagon, until the other bit arrives.

Normally at this time of year they get itchy feet and start thinking about putting some artificial fertilizer on to make sure there is plenty of grass for us to eat when we go out to graze, but with the price doubling since last spring I think there might not be so much spread, so we will have to rely on the clover and herbal leys they have sown to fix the nitrogen to make the grass grow.



## CAN YOU SPARE A LITTLE TIME?

The Wincanton Ring and Ride service would welcome volunteers to drive a minibus. The bus is used almost exclusively to collect members of the Live at Home Scheme, take them to an activity and return them to their homes afterwards. The task does not normally take longer than four hours.

You do not need a PSV licence nor do you have to commit to a fixed schedule. You will be asked if you can take on a job and you can either accept or refuse as you wish. The more drivers we have the easier it is for all of us.

# PROPOSED CHANGESTOTHE HIGHWAY CODE

The following changes due to come into effect on 29-1-2022 and the government are not intending to advertise them until later on in the year. .

The changes will affect all road users and pedestrians.

Drivers will are to give more priority to horse riders, cyclists and pedestrians, and everyone will have to give way to pedestrians that are waiting to cross a road they are turning into, or at a zebra crossing, they no longer have to be ON the crossing.

Under the new rules, cars turning left or right will have to give way to cyclists coming from behind and going straight on.

Cyclists will be advised to ride in the middle of the road when approaching junctions - currently they ride on the left-hand side.

Pedestrians, cyclists, horse riders and motorcyclists are deemed to be the most vulnerable as they are more likely to be injured.

The idea is that someone cycling will have greater responsibility to look out for people walking, while someone driving will have to be more aware of people cycling, walking or riding a horse.

Cars and other larger vehicles are at the bottom of the list as they are capable of the greatest harm and have the most responsibility to reduce the danger they pose on the road.

The new structure will be introduced to ensure the protection of road users, creating a hierarchy of safeguarding starting with the most vulnerable road users.

### NEW GUIDANCE ON PASSING DISTANCES

Advice for motorists overtaking pedestrians, cyclists and horses.

Leave a minimum distance of 1.5m at speeds under 30mph

Leave a minimum distance of 2m at speeds over 30mph

Always leave a distance of 2m if driving a large vehicle

Pass horses and horse drawn vehicles at speeds under 15mph at a minimum of 2m

Allow 2m of distance when passing a pedestrian who is walking in the road

Wait behind the motorcyclist, cyclist, horse rider or pedestrian if it is unsafe to meet these clearances.
