

The table is a place of welcome - a place where people slow down and connect.





Did you know?

Easter this year falls on Sunday 17th April, but the date varies from one year to the next. It can be as early as March 22nd or as late as April 25th. Why does the date vary? Well, it all depends on the date of a new moon in Spring ...

In the ecclesiastical calendar in each year there will be only one new moon on a date between March 8 and April 5, both inclusive. This date marks the beginning of the Paschal Lunar month for that year, and thirteen days later (that is, from March 21 and April 18) is the Paschal Full Moon.

Easter is the first Sunday after the Paschal Full Moon, unless it is itself a Sunday, in which case Easter is one week later.

Lent, the 40-day season leading up to Easter, reminds us of the 40 days that Jesus spent in the wilderness before commencing his journey to Jerusalem. But if you count the days to Easter starting on Ash Wednesday, there are actually 46 days.

Why? Because Sundays are Feast Days so do not count. Does this mean that on each Sunday during Lent you can binge on whatever you have denied yourself during the week?





OUR BUSES ARE STILL UNDER THREAT

BETTER BUS CHARTER FOR SOMERSET

We need to do something about improving our buses in Somerset. Our county currently has the second lowest level of bus journeys per resident of all the counties in England, and Somerset's bus services have the very lowest level of passenger satisfaction in the country.

Residents of Somerset experience this every day, whether it's with difficulties getting to health services, reduced opportunities for those seeking work and further education or just the limited (if any) evening and Sunday bus services. As a result, we see ever increasing numbers of cars on our roads which causes higher levels of local air pollution and increase our carbon emissions.

Somerset Bus Partnership was formed just a year ago to campaign for better bus services across our county and already we have a Somerset-wide network of 115 town and parish transport representatives who share our passion for better buses.

Somerset residents have every right to expect better, but it will need funding.

We have developed a Somerset Bus Charter and invite not just Councillors but community groups, churches & residents to join with us & endorse it. Get in touch somersetbuspartnership@gmail.com

THE SOMERSET BUS CHARTER

BETTER BUSES FOR ALL OUR COMMUNITIES

We need a core network of frequent, high-quality services linking our towns and main villages with enhanced weekend and evening services. Also we want an extension of the demand-responsive 'Slinky' bus services, available to all and with longer operating hours.

AN INTEGRATED TRANSPORT NETWORK

We need bus routes to link with local railway stations with timetables that offer improved connections between buses and trains.

We also want to see the introduction of integrated ticketing across the county's different bus operators and with trains too.

PROMOTION OF EXISTING AND NEW SERVICES

We should be promoting the bus as an important way by which we all can address the climate emergency in Somerset (transport accounts for nearly half of all carbon emissions in Somerset). To enable more to go by bus, it is essential that current bus timetable information is shown at all main bus stops and bus times information is available in libraries and at other information points.

AN AFFORDABLE TRANSPORT SERVICE FOR ALL

We should make bus travel more attractive through cheaper fares especially targeted at young people up to the age of 25. Plus, for everyone, a new, all-operator, countywide value ticket. CLEANER BUSES

We want an accelerated transition from diesel buses to zero emission buses.

MEANINGFUL FUNDING OF BUS SERVICES

We need Somerset's bus budget to be brought progressively up to the average for similar rural authorities in the South West.

UDDER FARM NEWS



Hello I'm 501 you might remember seeing a photo of me in the September issue of Udder Farm News, I was the first calf born last year, at the start of the calving season on the farm. Also, my mum 347 wrote the April piece last year, so she has been telling me over the gate what I should tell you about this month.

Well, we have had a lovely time my sisters and brothers that were kept on the farm.

First we were on our lovely surrogate mother who supplied us with milk when we wanted it, as some of you that saw us at the Harvest celebration will remember, then when we were weaned we were allowed out into the big shed where our older sisters were and had a ration of silage and concentrate to eat, but we still had our big shed to sleep in, which was bedded down with lovely yellow straw, that came from the farm next door.

The milking cows, our mums, have been lucky enough to start going out to graze the grass that we can see growing from our shed, but it has been later than last year they were saying, due to the wind, not the methane sort, but the bad storms we had and the rain, at this time of year if it looks if it is going to be very wet during the day, they will keep our mums in to stop them making a mess of the fields.

I have herd that our older sisters will be the next to go out, in early April hopefully. Most probably in a field near you, in the village. My Mum said that last year she asked all the dogs in the villages to make sure that they kept their owners on a lead when they were walking the footpaths in our fields, some dogs obviously have more control over their owners than others as she said she saw some off the lead in the fields she was in, last year. She also said that in some fields there are little white bundles frolicking around with their mothers, so it is also important for dogs, to keep owners on a lead if walking through a field with sheep in it.

In some fields there will be areas around the outside of fields that look a bit scruffy with long grass and other plants in them. These areas are left like that intentionally, they are known as set a side, this is so that some of the ground nesting birds can nest without being disturbed, so dogs please keep your owners out of these areas, also there can be ticks in long grass which will latch onto you and suck your blood, they say it's quite painful to have them removed, I think I herd it said that Humans can also get ticks on them which causes a nasty disease, you wouldn't want that to happen to them would you?

Hopefully by the next time some one writes we will all be out enjoying the fresh grass and summer sun, here's hoping.
