

DEFIBRILLATOR TRAINING

The defibrillator training was well attended by both villages. We covered how to recognise when someone is in cardiac rest, ie not responsive and not breathing and so needs CPR and a defibrillator and were reminded to dial 999 as soon as possible for professional medical help. We learnt how to perform effective CPR, and the need to keep going with this until the defibrillator is set up on the patient and/or ambulance arrives.

The defibrillator is **so important** as it can detect whether there is a rhythm and what kind of shock it needs to get the heart pumping blood around the body again and ultimately supplying oxygen to the brain.

Our nearest one is in the phone box, outside The Unicorn Pub in Bayford, although others can be found in phone boxes at Cucklington, Charlton Musgrove and the petrol station in Bourton.

Our machine is designed to be used by anyone with no training as it issues instructions as soon as it is turned on. However we also have 4 local volunteer first responders that you can call for assistance:

UDDER FARM NEWS

242 here just to let you know that a very nice man came and retested me for TB.



Luckily I didn't react to the second lot of jabs I had, so I am no longer an inconclusive reactor. This means I can re-join my friends and they are allowed to sell animals if they need too, no restrictions on our movements now.

The other happening since last ramblings is that they have made a lot of silage for us to eat next winter. They cut the first lot in April, this has never been known here before, but hopefully due to the time of year that it was cut it should be very good quality, which should save them buying in so much expensive concentrate.

They then cut again six weeks later and it looks from our fields that there is more in the silage clamps, than there was this time last year. We hope that they have got it right, because where it was so wet last May and they made the silage in June, the grass had gone past its best, but at least it was palatable but they had to balance it with expensive concentrate.

The next thing we have to look forward too, is its coming up to the time we are dried off, this is when we are allowed out in the fields to rest before we calve. Which is a bit like going on holiday for 2 months. Then mid August we will start calving and the year begins again for us.
