But have you noticed that Jesus does not tend to give motivational talks about self sacrifice nor does he try to engage our will power. Jesus is much more concerned about shaking our foundations, giving us an utterly alternate self image, world image and God image - indeed in reframing our entire reality!

Trying harder might bring a few temporary changes but it doesn't bring radical transformation. It's still just "little ol' me" who's trying harder, thinking better or doing something different. Transformation comes only from the new self "hidden with Christ in God" (Colossians 3:3).

The real "try harder" of Lent is, ironicily, a not trying at all! It is rather an ultimate surrendering, a dying and a foundational letting go to God. It's not doing something for ourselves but allowing it to be done to us by the events of our lives; joining with Mary in "let it be to me according to your will" (Luke 1:38). We are participants in transformative change only as we yield and realise with the Apostle Paul "I live no longer my own life, but the life of Christ who lives in me" (Galatians 2:20).

The Lent Course looks at some of the promises of God that impart transformation and unshakeable hope as we surrender our doubting, despairing, cynical selves into His hands. Do join us - it'll be fun!

#### A better way

Culture, it's said, is 'how things get done around here'. This suggests that our understanding of the world is largely formed by our experiences and what we're accustomed to. That's all fine until everything around



us, as it does, keeps on changing. Then we're then set on a collision course between how we think things should be, and how they actually are. Anybody aged over 40 who's had to ask a nine year old how to use their new phone will understand this dilemma perfectly.

Cultural collisions aren't just restricted to technology. They affect churches too. Many of us grew up with a model of church set up by the Victorians. This mostly meant that each parish had one church building with its own vicar, who took responsibility for most aspects of the ministry needed in a particular place. Yet even this was new in its day. Look much further back and things worked very differently. The New Testament speaks of churches where lots of different people played many different roles, each operating out of the particular skills and gifts given them by God. In Ephesians the writer describes a church where 'some [are] apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers'.

So what would be the right model of church for our day? The Victorians' assumption that the vicar would do almost everything would seem to be a crying waste of the gifts and passions that together we share. And as more of our clergy care for three, six or more parishes, the nineteenth century model is increasingly leaving our vicars tired, overstretched and liable to burn out.

We need a better way; one that draws on the rich talents, abilities and skills that our church members have. Here in Bath and Wells we're calling this 'shared local ministry'. Examples of what that can look like exist in many places around our diocese. Neither first century nor nineteenth century, but an emerging twenty first century way of how we want 'to get things done around here'. A better way to inhabit well the faith we've inherited in our time and generation.

#### ARE YOU ON ST LAWRENCE, CUCKLINGTON'S ELECTORAL ROLL?

WHAT IS THE ELECTORAL ROLL?

The church's Electoral Roll is the register of its voting members; it is a list of those qualified to attend and to vote at the Annual Parochial Church Meeting. Electoral rolls provide an indication of the real

membership and strength of the church.

ARE YOU NEW TO THE AREA? If so, you might want to join. If you were on it last year, you don't need to reapply.

#### WHO CAN BE ONTHE ELECTORAL ROLL?

Baptised adults (over 16 years) who live in the parish, or who have worshipped regularly at the church for at lest six months (or who would have attended had sickness not prevented them) who are

committed to being part of the life of the local Church of England congregation.

#### WHY JOIN?

Enrolment is a way of saying "I belong." It is an act of commitment to the local church and to the church as a whole. It opens the way for a greater involvement in the life of the church at parish, deanery, diocesan and national levels.

## VILLAGES' WALKING GROUP

Friday 24<sup>th</sup> February is the date for our next VWG group walk. Where we shall walk is not yet clear, but rest assured we shall let all those on our VWG mailing list know in good time.

With so many of our local footpaths, and those in neighbouring villages, presently waterlogged, and gateways deep in mud, we are limited by what is possible. 

# **UDDER FARM NEWS**

Hello 247 here again, yes I know we forgot to let you know what was going on in the last newsletter, but we were all getting so excited about it coming up to Christmas that we completely forgot to write anything. I don't know why we were getting so excited because they came out a lot earlier than normal, so we had to get up earlier than ever. This was so they could be inside early to see what Father Christmas had brought them and to get the dinner on. No such luck for us we had the same ration as the day before, at least it was earlier. Then when they did come out in the afternoon, they both got on with it and milked together so that they could go in early to have more to eat and I suspect drink.

2022 was a strange year for us as it started off reasonably dry for the first few months of the year and we were able to go out early to eat the fresh spring grass. They decided that as it was still dry in April that they would make some silage, which was the earliest that they have every made it. We thought they were mad, but as it turned out they were right, as most of May it was raining. This resulted in them being able to take the second cut a week later than they finished the first cut in 2021. This is really tasty silage but as the year went on and it had less rain and more dry hot days, the grass didn't grow very much, and the third cut was not such good quality. The fourth cut was as late as has ever been taken in November, we aren't expecting much from this though.

One day we herd them talking as one of them had taken his children ice skating before Christmas, (no kids here, as we don't have any goats.) and had decided to have a cup of coffee to warm up. The person serving him asked if he would like OAT MILK, SOYA MILK or COWS MILK. He said that as two of them were only plant juices, as oats or soya did not have mammary glands, that he would have cows milk. The person serving did not answer to this.

We are also getting a bit worried from what we have herd on the radio whilst we are milking. It appears there is a new month at the beginning of the year now, called Veganuary. The reason we are worried is in case those people that want a plant only diet will come and start eating our feed, we are sure we can convert plants into a much more nutritious food.

Hope you all have a Happy New Year and the sun shines and the rain comes at the right time, some hope.
