What an opportunity!

This week I was on a Zoom chat with some of our chaplains around the diocese. I meet regularly with eight or nine of them alongside our Chaplaincy Development Adviser Mike Haslam. These are only a few of the more than 300 chaplains we have, of all ages, lay and ordained, across Bath and Wells. There are more and more enquiries about chaplaincy from a wide range of communities. They are seeking a chaplain to offer pastoral care and well-being support for an increasingly stressed and anxious workforce. One particular enquiry caught my attention this week.

A local Further Education college has been saying that their first concern is for a chaplain to address the spiritual exploration of its students. What an opportunity! We know from the Talking Jesus research (2015 and 2022) that most practising Christians come to faith before the age of 18. Several of our schools, including primary, have pupil chaplains now and this is a great way of recognising that you are never too young to start in living and telling the story of Jesus!

As a child I was always struck by the Old Testament story of the unnamed little slave girl who served Naaman's wife, (2 Kings chapter 5). Taken from her home to another country, and placed in an alien environment, she was the one who introduced Naaman to Elisha the prophet in Israel. As a result, Naaman overcame his scepticism, was healed from his leprosy, and discovered a faith in God.

Chaplaincy opens up a diversity of contexts in which we can share our faith and I invite you to pray for those here in Bath and Wells who are treading new ground to open up the way for others to discover the love of Jesus for themselves. However, each one of us has our own possibility of being a chaplain, coming alongside another in our daily life and community. Sometimes our timidity prevents us from speaking up about faith and our personal spiritual journey other than in church where we are known and on familiar territory. How about taking some time to reflect on where you might live and tell the story of Jesus outside of church, in your everyday context? Is there someone, like a Naaman's wife who is desperate to find help and hope for a loved one but doesn't know where to find it? Maybe you are the only one who could tell them!

I wanted to let you know the outcome of our recent email canvass of village opinion about whether or not to renew our SWAST defibrillator contract at the end of this month.

Over 40% of those consulted were good enough to respond and the result was pretty conclusive: of 38 replies, 35 voted 'yes', 1 'no' and 2 'not certain'.

Consequently, we went ahead and renewed the contract for the next four years from 28 September 2023.

Memorial Hall Coffee Morning

There will be coffee, tea and cake with the opportunity to catch up with neighbours and friends. All this for £2.00. Any surplus monies made will go to local charities at the end of the year.

UDDER FARM



349 here, the udder day when we were walking back up the road, from our holiday fields, to the farm we herd someone ask “ when do you know when they are going to calve ?” to one of the people stood in the road, to turn us up Strap Lane.

Well it all starts approximately 9 months previously for us. It actually starts a lot earlier than this really, because when we start calving in August, they start receiving glossy pamphlets full of pictures of the fathers, of our offspring, from the AI companies (artificial insemination companies not artificial intelligence companies) a bit like playboy for some of you. These pamphlets not only have pictures of the bulls they will use but facts and figures about the way the bull will influence the body size, milking speed, temperament, mobility, milk quality and amount of milk, as well as a lot of other traits, that should be passed on to their offspring. They then try and decide which of these bulls they think will be right to mate with us, if we are small in stature they may use a bull that will make our daughters larger or if we are large and bulky a more petite bull, also they may choose a different breed to try and get hybrid vigour, this is why we are mainly a cross bred (mixed race herd), of many different colours. Many of the dairy bulls now come with sexed semen, this means we should only have female calves, which is an advantage for them as the male dairy breeds of calf are not so valuable to them and they have to be sold to another farm to be reared. But some breeds are known as dual purpose, dairy and beef so the semen from these bulls is not sexed.

When they start inseminating us they normally use a dairy bull on us, so that our daughters are born early on in the calving season, this means that in future years they will be the oldest and be ready to calve when they are two years old. The young heifers that have not had a calf are normally served first, this is so when they do calve they get a chance to come into the herd when a lot of the older cows are on holiday (dry) and establish themselves in the herd. They try and get as many of us in calf in the first six weeks of the service period to a dairy bull, after this they either inseminate us with a beef bull or let Bruce/Dick our own friendly Aberdeen Angus bull roam amongst us to get us in calf.

Getting back to the question that I started with, the answer is that all of the service dates are recorded, in the farm diary and also on the farm computer and breeding board. This will then work out when 283 days(the average gestation period of a cow) is, which should be the calving date. One of the traits in there glossy pamphlets is the gestation length of the bull, as this varies from bull to bull and breed to breed.

I have just calved, so I expect they are looking at the glossy pamphlets, trying to decide which should be the best bull to serve me with, when the time comes and the long arm length plastic gloves appear, then in 9 months' time, after this I will be able to see which bull they used.

Last year I had the long arm plastic glove treatment on the 4th December and gave birth on the 9 September this year, which means the gestation length was just short of average(279 days), but they were ready for us.

The Balsam Centre in Wincanton

The Balsam Centre is a charity based in Wincanton, though it serves the local communities within a 10-mile radius. Its purpose is to support the health and wellbeing of people living in rural areas nearby.

- Specialist support for mental health by our team of professional wellbeing workers
