## We Three Kings?



In the Christian tradition, the New Year celebrates Epiphany and the arrival of kings or magi to visit the infant Jesus. Over the centuries, it's been assumed there were three men with crowns, camels and names (Caspar, Melchior and Balthazar) but tradition isn't always accurate. What does the Bible say about their coming?

The gospel account of the Magi in Matthew doesn't mention names, numbers or camels. However, the

prophet Isaiah does. He predicts that, at a time of darkness, the glory of the Lord will shine over Jerusalem. The heavenly light will be a beacon to the pagan nations and even to their kings (Isaiah 60). Camels will bring the wealth of the nations, including frankincense and gold, to the city of the Lord.

But Isaiah 60 refers to only two of the gifts mentioned by Matthew: gold, fit for a king, and frankincense, for the worship of God. So what about the myrrh–where does that come from and what does it mean?

Myrrh, an aromatic resin, was used in preparing the dead for burial. Gold reveals that the babe in the manger is actually a king; frankincense tells us that is he God incarnate; myrrh tells us that he has come to die. That someone would redeem God's people through suffering and death was also foretold by Isaiah (chapter 53). This was the really hard thing for those living in Jesus' time to understand – that the same person who fulfilled all those prophecies about a glorious new king also fulfilled the prophecies about a suffering servant.

So all three gifts of the Magi are necessary to convey the true revelation, the true epiphany of who this child is and what he is destined to do. That's why for hundred's of years we've sung of three kings, not two or four! May you too have revelation this year of who Jesus is as both Saviour and King!

# **UDDER FARM**

In politics they say that a week is a long time and things can change drastically. Well I can tell you a year is a very long time in farming, with the help of the weather it can be a good year or you can be struggling all year.

This time last year we were very short of silage and home grown feed for the cattle, due to it being a very dry summer [2022]. But we did get the cows out reasonably early, due to it being a dry spring. This year was completely different, it was dry so we let the cows out, then it rained so we had to have them back into the yards, then it dried up so we let them out again, then it rained and we had to have them in again. Then when it did dry up it got very dry and we were looking for grass. The first cut silage cut was a good one as due to the mild winter the grass kept growing, the problem with this was that the quality was not so good, which is affecting the quality of the silage we are feeding now. The second cut was taken in early July when it was very dry and the quantity was on the low side, however the third cut taken in September was very good on quantity but not so good on quality, at least it was light when we were doing it, as last year it was November and it was difficult in the dark seeing where you had to go!

Another major difference between last year and this is the milk price, last year in October we were receiving 50pence per litre sold, this year we received 36.75pence per litre. As we are selling about 100,000 litres a month I will let you work out how much we are not receiving this year compared to last year, yes some of our input costs have fallen, but not by 25-26%.

It hasn't all been a struggle though as at least we know we have plenty of fodder for the cows and should have some in reserve for next summer if we have a very dry period as we did this year and appears to be the norm now. The cows also had a very good calving period and we didn't have to help very many. We now have a shed full of calves, which should be out in a field near you in the summer.

I hope you all had a good Christmas and New Year and you will keep eating cheese in the coming months.

You can now see why when asked what sort of farm do you have? I reply that I am a hobby farmer as I don't do it for the money.
