

The fullness of life - now

I was struck by an article by Janet Street-Porter in the Independent on Sunday which was titled, 'Better a full life than an endless one.' She was commenting on some new research being funded by a group of technology billionaires, Mark Zuckerberg of Facebook being one of them, who were looking into the possibility of extending human life.

In her classically direct style she concludes, "I can see no reason to extend my life beyond what is normal and have no intention of copying Mr Zuckerberg and turning into a wrinkly 125 year old reliant on gadgets and supplements to get me through my dreary day."

We are in the Easter season and there is always a temptation to consider eternal life as the promise of some kind of endless life in the future, but the gospel of John in particular is keen to emphasise that the promise of Easter is not fullness of life in the future, but fullness of life NOW. Of course that is not simply a selfish hope that my life will be full, but rather a gospel imperative that those who believe in the Easter story should work and pray for fullness of life for all humankind, not least amongst the poor and the dispossessed.

A native Indian tribe in North America has a tradition. At the end of each day, each member of the tribe is invited to collect a stone – a white stone if it has been a good day and a black stone if it has been a bad day. When they die the stones are poured out over their body. If there are more white stones than black stones the whole community celebrates. If it is the other way round everyone goes home.

May those of us who believe the Easter story so live our lives to the full, not just for ourselves but for the welfare of all humankind, so that the number of white stones will always overflow into celebration.

FROM THE RECTORY

The Easter celebrations begin in church simply, with the lighting of a candle. It is accompanied by a straightforward and quiet but triumphant proclamation of the confusing hope that lies at the heart of the Christian faith. "Christ is risen. Alleluia" I shall say. "He is risen indeed. Alleluia!" the congregation replies.

It is this hope that Christians cling to and let challenge us in the midst of the ups and downs, joys and sorrows of our lives. In the face of corruption and greed, we cry, "he is risen"; in the face of narrow-mindedness and intolerance, we cry, "he is risen"; in the face of illness, grief, sorrow and mortality, we cry, "he is risen". As we face up to our own weakness, failure and unkindness, we cry, "he is risen". As we face our fear, we cry, "he is risen".

It is this hope that gives foundation to the offering of our gifts and talents for our world's remaking. It is this hope that undergirds our laughter, our celebrations and our joys. It is this hope that makes us dare to look for him, even now, as our companion.

On Easter morning, the female pupils of Jesus went to his tomb to anoint his body for burial, to say their final goodbyes. When they got there, the tomb was wide open and the body gone. They fled in fear, a fear that was overwhelmed by joy as they met him face to face, at the tomb entrance, in the Upper Room, on the Emmaus road, at the lakeside in Galilee. He promised to be with them always and that they would be cleansed, renewed and filled by the very Spirit of God. And as that happened, some weeks later, they gave the simple news to any who would hear, he is risen! And that cry has been passed on, from person to person, from one generation to the next, from then until now by those who in many different ways and in different times, ages, countries and contexts have come face to face with the risen Jesus. He gives us quiet confidence in the face of death and gentle courage to walk the way of love. May the love of the risen Jesus surround you this Easter and always.




Decorating for Easter


VILLAGE NOTICES

RING AND RIDE SCHEME

The Wincanton Ring and Ride Scheme covers not only the town itself but also outlying villages including Bayford, Stoke Trister, Cucklington and Charlton Musgrove. Aimed primarily at those who are not on a bus route or do not have their own transport it offers two services: wheelchair- capable minibuses and private cars driven by volunteers. Members of the scheme, which costs a one-off payment of $\pounds 2$ to join, can use either for example to go shopping, to keep a hospital appointment or even to go to the hairdresser. To join or to book transport, giving reasonable notice if possible, please ring the office on 01963 33864. Office hours are 0930 – 1230.

Fares are very reasonable and those holding a bus pass travel at concessionary rates.
