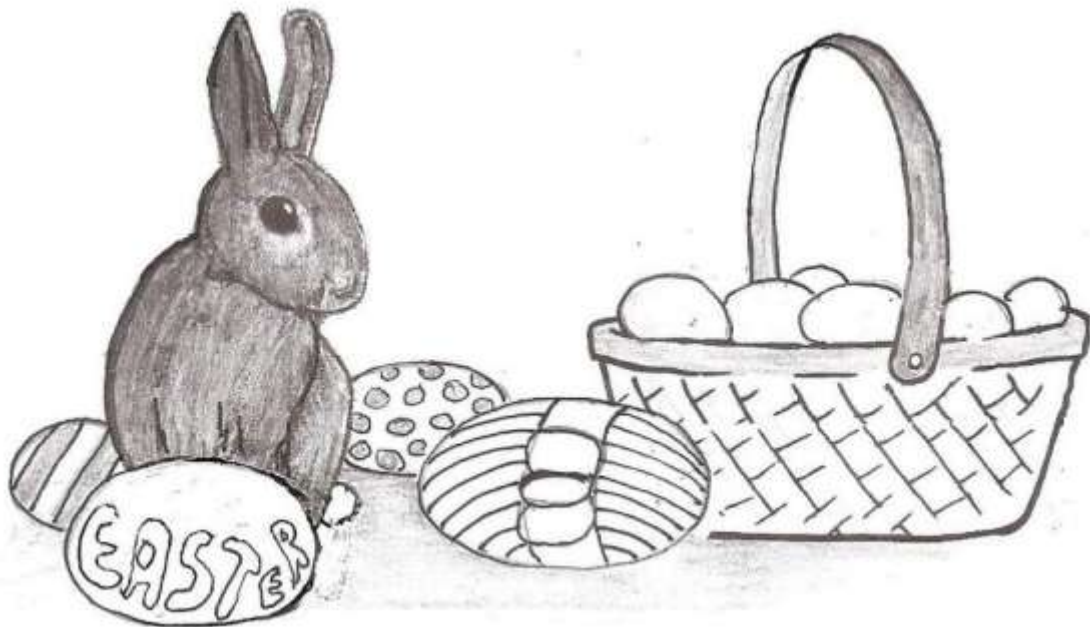

FROM THE BISHOP OF TAUNTON

Let's pray, celebrate, remember and hope

The daily reflections that I'm using during Lent came up with this gem from Jonathan Sacks, the Chief Rabbi, this morning – 'Be part of a community. There is something transformative about being part of a group who pray, celebrate, remember, and hope together.' That seemed a pretty good thought as we prepare to celebrate again the Easter Feast.

Easter Day is not so much about what may or may not have happened to 'the body'. Easter day invites us to consider what difference the resurrection makes to you and to me, here and now, in our living and loving. As we pray, celebrate, remember, and hope together on Easter morning, will we be transformed by God's radically inclusive love?

Easter challenges us about how we are to live in the light of resurrection. Whatever Peter may have felt about himself in the wake of his betrayal, the risen Christ makes it clear very quickly that what happened then is now in the past. There are no old scores to be settled, no grudges to be held. Jesus forgives and opens the way to a new beginning.

It is forgiveness, reconciliation and the hope of new beginnings that lie at the heart of the Christian story, and they must be at the heart of our story. There are too many scores being settled, grudges being held, and revenges being taken, in the way we behave in the church, in our families, our communities and among nations.

The defiant inclusiveness of Jesus which we see throughout his life, welcoming the prodigal, eating with the tax collectors, receiving the ministry of women, lived on in the church which threw its doors open to the gentiles, the outsiders, in spite of all that had been taught in the older religion. Yet as a church we continue to be in dispute with each other about who is in and who is out. We are in danger of setting up what Bishop John Taylor called 'passports to legitimacy', closing our doors on those who don't happen to fit our image of what it means to be Christian. Our living and our loving, both as members of the church, as well as members of society must reflect an Easter God who, in the words of Revelation, 'sets before us an open door which no one can shut.'

So, this Easter, pray, celebrate, remember, and hope together and be part of a community that seeks to change lives for good. 'We shall go out', writes June Boyce-Tillman, 'with hope of resurrection, we'll sing our song of wrongs that can be righted, we'll dream our dream of hurts that can be healed; we'll weave a cloth of all the world united within the vision of a Christ who sets us free.'

FROM THE RECTORY

On April 8th, at a little after 6am at St Stephen's, the cry will be heard, "Christ is risen Alleluia", and "He is risen indeed, Alleluia" will come the reply. All across the Christian church on April 8th in the west, and April 15th in the east, this cry will be repeated as Christians gather to celebrate Easter once more.

It is a cry of bearing witness to something inexplicable that happened on that first Easter morning. And Christians, knowing how ridiculous it sounds, have continued to do this throughout the centuries, ever since the angels first proclaimed "He is not here, he is risen" to the terrified women who had come to Jesus' borrowed tomb to wash and anoint the body of the one they loved. The large stone blocking the entrance to the tomb had been rolled away, the meagre grave clothes were neatly folded and left in the empty tomb; young men told those who came looking that the now risen Jesus would find them. And the testimony of his first disciples, women and men, was that find them he did; in the garden near the tomb, behind locked doors in Jerusalem, on the road to Emmaus, at the Sea of Galilee. Thomas, called doubting Thomas because he said he wouldn't believe unless he could touch the nail marks on Jesus' wrists and put his hand in the spear wound in Jesus' side, spent the rest of his life telling the story of how he did just that.

Dead men do not rise. The Church knows this. Christians today know this and yet still we proclaim, he is risen. We weren't there, we didn't see, but we trust the words of those who were because we too, equally inexplicably, have found ourselves confronted by the reality of the risen Jesus. That is the testimony we add to the words of the apostles. Into our lives, the life, the goodness, the love, the reality of the crucified and risen Jesus has come. The testimony of every Christian will be different. For some, Christ comes with a bang and a start so that people can say when and where, they believed. For others, it is a gradual realizing and for still others, brought up in the faith or not, there was simply no time when they didn't believe. Christ is Risen: He is Risen indeed: Alleluia.

WHY DOES EASTER MOVE?

Easter Day this year is on April 8th, but in other years it can be as early as March 22nd, or as late as April 25th. The date changes because it is calculated as "the first Sunday after the first full moon after the Vernal (Spring) Equinox".

The Spring Equinox this year is on Tuesday March 20th & the next full moon after that date is on Friday April 6th, so Easter Day will be Sunday April 8th.

The last time Easter Day was on the earliest possible date was in 1818, and this will not happen again until 2285. It last fell on the latest possible date, April 25th, in 1943, and this will happen again quite soon - in 2038. Last year it was only one day earlier than the latest possible date, but this won't happen again until 2095. It was also just one day later than the earliest possible date quite recently, in 2008, which won't occur again until 2160. The most common date for Easter Day is April 19th, and the cycle of dates repeats every 5,700,000 years. Truly a moveable feast!
