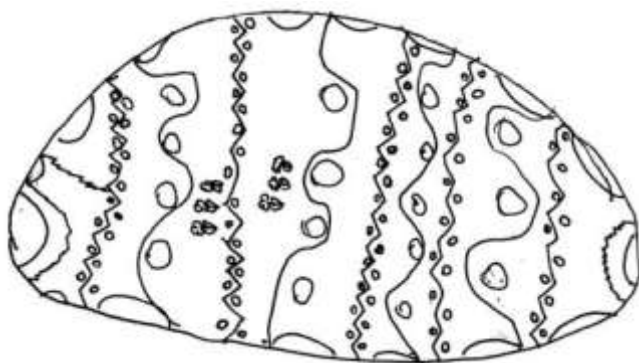

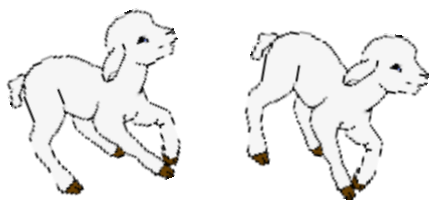

FROM THE RECTORY

As the rain and storm surges ease, life in Somerset resumes. For those poor people, still out of their homes or contemplating the businesses that will no longer earn them and their families a living, it is by no means “back to normal” however. And although, it doesn’t make the headlines, this life going on but not or never back to normal, is experienced time after time across our communities when illness or bereavement strike. It’s not so much as life must go on but life does go on, whether we will it or not.

On April 20th this year, Easter Day is celebrated with chocolate and Easter bunnies, on a weekend when hopefully we can relax and start to enjoy the spring weather but that first Easter Sunday wasn’t a day to relax and enjoy. It wasn’t the happy ending to the sad story of Good Friday that we too easily imagine. The friends who had experienced Jesus being executed on Friday weren’t suddenly crying one minute, happy the next. In the way St Mark tells the story, the women who first heard the angels say “He is not here, he is risen” were absolutely terrified, ran away and said nothing to anyone. The resurrection of Jesus isn’t a happy ending; it is a terrifying, startling new beginning that calls us, not to live with fixed grins and forced jollity, but to take tentative, careful and gradual steps into a new world where death, sorrow and sadness are still real but not the whole story, where love and kindness are the only treasure that will outlive the rust and the moths, inflation and bank crises. Whether we rush away at the angels’ first call or stay with Mary Magdalene to be surprised by the Risen Christ, Easter is the wake up call that tells us nothing, not even death itself, will stand in the way of God meeting us in Jesus. He is the one with whom we have to deal.

STOKE TRISTER WITH BAYFORD

I sadly announce the death of my beloved husband **Ian Purseglove**. Ian and I came to live in Stoke Trister in August 1988 and he often said that it was the best thing we could have done. He loved living here not only because of the beauty of the place but because of the wonderful friends and neighbours with which we were surrounded. During the many very serious illnesses he experienced we witnessed the support that you all gave – memorably when the ladies of the village appeared in a snowstorm with shovels to dig me out so I could visit him, on death's door, in Birmingham in 1996. (A neighbour (male) ambled past and commented it would be easier for me simply to drive over the snow! Which I did!) Ian recovered from that illness with a liver transplant and resumed his life as a musician, teaching, performing and examining and he kept going with this until 2005 when tinnitus forced him to stop. Recently he has found life very hard and painful, but was still propelling himself around Morrisons perched over a trolley rather than give in. His death in Yeovil Hospital on March 8th was something of a release and I have now been the one in receipt of all your kindness for which I am most grateful.

Ian's funeral will be at 3.30pm on Saturday March 22nd at St Michael's Church Pen Selwood. He will be interred afterwards at St Andrew's Church Stoke Trister in a private ceremony. Please do not send flowers; instead donations are invited for The British Liver Trust or the Haemophilia Society.
