The adventure of Christmas

I passed a shop this summer which had Christmas goods and Christmas cards on offer and it was still only August! Every year shops seem to start their Christmas displays a week earlier. But in the annual rush to Christmas (which we all have a sinking feeling about) we risk losing a great deal. In particular we lose the distinctive emphases of Advent which is a season of preparation and expectation.

In Advent we are invited to be still, to be watchful and to be prayerful and to prepare ourselves to celebrate once again the birth of Christ. The word Advent suggests both 'Event' and 'Adventure' and Christmas is both of those things. Christmas is when we remember the birth of a baby in a stable in Bethlehem: a baby who was God himself. This was God taking our nature upon himself and putting into effect his great plan of love, whereby we might be reunited with our Creator. That stable in Bethlehem may seem a long way away from us, but God's love is the same. This is an event for us and our families today - an event to be celebrated.

But Christmas is also an adventure. It was an adventure for the shepherds who 'returned glorifying and praising God for all that they had heard and seen' (Luke 2:20). It is an adventure for us as we open our lives and our homes to God. It is an adventure as we look forward to 2015 and all that that may mean for us. It is an adventure as we trust ourselves and those we love to Christ as Saviour and Lord.

So let me challenge you to take time this Advent to make a space in the rush to pause, to be still, to reflect and to prepare for the wonder and joy that is Christmas. Let us pray that all our church services and activities will help us draw nearer to God and help us to concentrate on the great 'event' and great 'adventure' which is at the heart of all we are celebrating. Furthermore, let us ensure that this Christmas is centred more around the coming of Christ and the needs of others, and less around ourselves.

May God grant you a peace - filled Advent and a joy-filled Christmas.

From the Rectory

We can't really complain anymore if the shops are playing Christmas tunes and festooned with decorations. Christmas really is once again almost upon us. As the nights are getting longer and darker, and the temperature drops, it is easy to understand why our ancestors from long ago needed a midwinter festival to cheer them up and easy to see why, in the spirit of, if you can't beat them, join them, the Church decided it was as good a time as any to celebrate the birth of Jesus. Times weren't easy in Palestine/Israel when Jesus was born, times aren't easy there now. Whatever the angels sang in the night sky above Bethlehem to tell the shepherds about the baby's birth, there is still not "peace on earth, good will towards men". Israeli rabbis have been blown up at prayer in Jerusalem and Palestinian inhabitants of Bethlehem hemmed in and trapped by the wall that separates farmers from their land and olive groves and everyone from the sources of fresh water.

Christians in Israel-Palestine have asked for prayers for peace in the Holy Land to be held on the 24th of every month. If you can at the start of your Christmas festivities, find time to pray for those who still live in the town and land of Jesus' birth.

Eternal God, in your love for this world,

you have made places of great beauty.

And always where heaven is present, hell is never far off.

This is our experience; it is the lot of your people.

We recognise it in the world.

Today, we come to hold before you that land on which your son put his feet and first walked the path to heaven across the terrain of the earth.

Help us, as we enter into solidarity with those who are our brothers and sisters in faith and in humanity, not to keep apart Palestinian and Israeli in our prayers, but rather to try with you, and under your guidance,

to find a way of holding the broken pieces,

that in our lives and through our prayers,

some greater health and some sign of wholesomeness might come,

and a glimpse of your kingdom appear in our hearts and on this earth. Amen.



The quiz night at Charlton Musgrove Memorial Hall was a good test of knowledge and of memory. Groans of "oh, I knew that perfectly well!" came pretty often when we heard the answers. The victorious team of Dangers and Woods (with a small additional Graham) just beat John and Pauline Bastable supported by Hilary and John, by one point. Competition was hot and the field not far behind.

Thank you to the potato bakers and the barmen. We raised £350 in the course of a very cheerful evening

The Walkers riders and cyclist volunteer group have had a very busy year mending and improving the stiles in the parish. We have had twelve volunteer working days and not once did we get wet!! That was until November when we met up to clear our only Byway and it rained hard enough to make up for the 12 dry days and we all got soaked! However it is now all clear for riders to get through and Somerset Council are shortly clearing the byway outside our parish to enable access right through to Knowle Rock and Stoney Stoke. Sir Cameron Mackintosh has also cleared and massively improved our only bridleway which gives villagers access to a whole network of riding by permit through the Stavordale Estate and Stourhead Western Estate. We hope, if all goes well, to finish the stile mending by the end of the year. Thank you so much to all our landowners who have been fantastically supportive in allowing us to make walking in the village so much easier and more enjoyable. Most of our paths are now also easily accessible for dogs. Please keep your dog under close control as it can scare or harm farm animals. Please also remember that all dogs should be regularly wormed to prevent harmful parasites being passed to farm livestock and also clear up after your dog.

The group has decided to continue by designing and printing a leaflet of circular walks in the village next year. This will be circulated throughout the village and be available at our village hall and the village website. We are currently applying for grants to cover our costs and hope to start planning early in the New Year.
