Message from Bishop Peter December 2015

Dear Brothers and Sisters:

Jane and I have recently become grandparents for the first time and there is something very precious and wonderful about new life. This year there is a new baby in our family. And as Christmas approaches, we all find ourselves thinking about the image of baby Jesus lying in the manger. Our mind's eye paints a picture of an infant asleep in a stable. We might imagine his crying or laughter as he reacts to those around him; a tiny little figure in a fragile world. From the moment of his birth, Jesus is responding to those around him, longing to hear their voice.

In Jesus, God comes to us as an infant: approachable, pure, and eager for us to come close to him. As a child Jesus reaches out, arms outstretched eager for a response. Thirty three years later those same arms would reach out on the cross, outstretched and open to the world in love and forgiveness.

As we enjoy Christmas with our friends and family let's be reminded of this image. Let's pray for God's blessing and peace for all those in troubled parts of the world and pray they hear God's call and respond with love. Let us also pray for God's peace and blessing to fill our own lives and the lives of those around us.

Amidst all the noise and distraction of Christmas let's find a moment to be still and listen again to the call of Jesus. The Christmas message is as loud and clear today as any baby's cry: Jesus, the Saviour of the World, is here and he's yearning to hear our voice. May we respond by saying: 'O Come to us, abide with us, Our Lord Emmanuel.'

The 2015 Real Advent Calendar Launches

At the end of October, Clergy and Readers from across the Diocese attended a training day to broaden their understanding of Church's ministry to people with disabilities, to learn about how to include them best in the life of their local church. The theme for the day which was introduced by Bishop Peter was 'From access to belonging.'

The mission statement from the Disability Inclusion Policy reads: "We are made in the image of God, and as such all people are of equal importance and significance....in God there is no distinction between those who identify themselves as disabled and those who do not."

The definition of disability is much broader than we sometimes think, so any church congregation is likely to have a considerable number of people living with disability. I attended a workshop titled 'Embracing Dementia'. The Methodists have produced a book called 'Growing dementia friendly churches', (£5.00). There were suggestions for shorter services, with familiar hymns; singing is good for the brain and gives a spiritual rhythm to life. For people with dementia it is good to rekindle memories in the present moment - God's now. We should step across their threshold into their world and meet them where they are.

We were provided with lists of books and the names of several Christian organisations that offer information and resources on disability inclusion for churches. There was information on how to audit the church building and its surroundings, to make them more user friendly and alleviate worry for those who are prone to anxiety. We were given much food for thought. Information is available from <u>opentoall@bathwells.org.uk</u>.

During this month when we celebrate our Saviour's birth, many Saints and Holy Ones are also commemorated. In this dark time of the year St. Lucy,s life is celebrated on 13th of Dec. the date on which she is thought to have died in Syracuse in Sicily In C7th St. Aldhelm, Bishop of Sherborne, wrote about her in verse and prose. Her name has connotations of light and purity, many artists have painted her. Many churches in Italy are named for her and she is celebrated in Sweden with a festival of light, when young girls may process to church wearing candles in their hair during the dark time of the year.

St. John of the Cross died on 14th Dec. in 1591. He had been born in Spain near Avila in 1542. He developed a devotion to helping the sick and the poor. After studying with the Jesuits he became a Carmalite friar and studied at Salamanca University, the outstanding centre for theology in Spain. St. Teresa of Avila sent for him and he helped her with her project of founding and reforming Carmelite houses. Together they became great spiritual teachers, not only in their own Order, but of Spain and the universal Church. John was incarcerated in prison for a time where half starved he learnt to rely solely on God. Whilst there he wrote the most deeply mystical poetry of the Spiritual Canticle and The Dark night of the Soul. He is known as the mystical doctor who guided men and women on their interior journey towards God. 'The more God gives the more he makes us desire, until we are empty and he is able to fill us with good things'.

St. Stephen, the first martyr of the Church, is celebrated on 26th, a date which in Eire is referred to as St. Stephen's Day rather than Boxing Day. St. John Apostle and Evangelist, who wrote his great light filled Gospel has his feast day on 27th and St. Thomas a Becket, Archbishop of Canterbury, martyr on 29th.

May the example of their lives and the gift of their words help sustain us in our own journeying from dark to light and the joy and hope of Christmas.

From the Organ Bench

Hills of the north, rejoice! River and mountain-spring, Hark to the advent voice, Valley and lowland, sing!

This stirring, inspirational hymn is one of my favourites. Written by Charles Oakley (1832-65), who was rector of Wickwar in Gloucestershire and then St. Paul's, Covent Garden in London until his untimely death, it was no doubt inspired by Jesus's ringing exhortation to his apostles at the end of St. Matthew's Gospel – 'Go out and teach all nations....'

In the 20th century Charles Oakley was criticised, quite wrongly, for glorifying the British Empire. In truth he was celebrating the spreading of the Christian gospel to parts of the world where it hadn't hitherto been known:

Shores of the utmost west, Ye that have waited long, Unvisited, unblest, Break forth to swelling song.

'Hills of the north' has suffered particularly at the hands of some hymnal editors who have substituted a colourless, committee-compiled, pastiche of the words. Fortunately the original version is in Hymns Ancient and Modern Revised, and we can still sing it vigorously at Advent, as well as at other times of the year.

The tune written for this hymn in 1915 by Martin Shaw (1875-1958) is a glorious accompaniment to the inspiration of the words. Its triumphant movement from C minor to E flat major graphically illustrates the progress from darkness to light which Charles Oakley so brilliantly described:

High raise the note, that Jesus died, Yet lives and reigns, the Crucified.
