

FROM THE RECTORY

Last year was rather a year, what with the Olympics and the Diamond Jubilee and now it's back to normal. Just like each year after Christmas, when cold dark January and February have to be endured before the buds of spring and the lighter mornings hold out a promise of summer. Well, we can but hope!!

One of my favourite things about this time of year are the shapes of trees, denuded of their leaves but magical in an entirely different way. To see the pinkish sky through their silhouettes is one of the beauties of winter. To me, they seem solid and enduring, standing through all manner of weather and human events, revealed as they really are, simply standing and biding their time, holding their reserves in check until..... Seeing them from different angles as I walk the dog or drive around the parishes heartens me. Their time scale is so much longer than ours and their solidity puts our hustle and bustle, our joys, our sorrows in perspective. They remind me that those things that cannot be mended, altered or changed simply have to be endured. The time for buds and birds nesting will come.

For each of us, there comes a time which we will not weather, for each of us, one day, tomorrow does not come. But come it will nevertheless for all those we love and care for, come it will for the enduring trees and heedless birds. One day, all this will go on without me, but go on it will, thank God. And whether I express the scandal of death by raging against it or the certainty of God's care by my trust, and both I think, are marks of the Holy Spirit, I will have no choice, when the time comes, but to move on. My leaves shall fall in hope of the eternal spring. This journey we shall all make once but we are invited each year in Lent to prepare ourselves by taking time between the celebration of Christmas and the joy of Easter, to reflect on what is really important and to ask ourselves whether the roots of our lives are planted deep, well protected and well nourished. As Lent progresses into Holy Week, we accompany Jesus once more on his final journey knowing that he does this, so that when our time comes, we shall not be alone.

Christmas is no sooner over than it's Lent! This year, we are using the Lent course provided by the Bath and Wells diocese, "Fit for Purpose?" which is designed to help us reflect on whether church life is "fit for purpose" in 2013. Bishop's Message – February 2013

Every year at this particular time, I am once again tempted to believe that hibernation is the only real option to deal with the cold, dark days of winter. This has undoubtedly been exacerbated this year by my own association with a particularly nasty virus which left me feeling like a toy racing car without its batteries! Although the days are beginning to get a little longer I still feel trapped in the depths of winter.

And then I looked out of my study window at the Palace and saw the return of the kingfisher. During all the work that was happening at the Palace last year, the kingfisher had decided to move house and I missed the flash of azure blue which was guaranteed to lift me out of whatever 'blues' I might have been experiencing. Suddenly the onset of spring did not feel so far away.

And I remembered what Gonville French Beytagh (former Dean of Capetown) used to say to us young clergy about his constant living with depression – 'in the depths of winter when the nights are at their longest and the earth appears to have given up on life, there under the soil the first shoots of spring are already sending their roots downwards in preparation for the onset of spring.' So in the midst of these dark days I am on the look out for the first signs of spring in the flight of the kingfisher, in the radiance of the snowdrop and in the bird song which is beginning to become more vocal.


Lent comes early this year and as many of you will know the word literally meant 'spring.' It is therefore a time when as Christians we might be on the lookout for signs of new life and new purpose in our own life of faith as well as in the life of our Christian communities. To help you do that, the Diocese has prepared a course entitled 'Fit for Purpose.' It is an invitation to explore afresh the purpose of God's church. What is our future and how can we live and worship in a way that can effectively live out the gospel in our various communities? Something to look forward to as the dark days of winter give way to the promise of new life that comes with the spring.


CHURCHYARD MAINTENANCE

South Western Ambulance Services Defibrillator Training at the Village Hall, Charlton Musgrove Thursday 7th March from 7pm onwards.

This is a very simple straight forward training programme for the community; we would like as many people to be involved as possible during the evening. Defibrillators save lives. CPR increases the chances of survival by 5%. A defibrillator can hike those chances up to 75% to 80% survival rate. Walkers riders and cyclists group

This group was formed as a result of the Charlton Musgrove parish plan to carry forward some of the actions suggested and to try and improve the rights of way in the village. We have had two meetings and are in the process of carrying out a survey of all the rights of way in the village to establish where improvements and maintenance might be required. We are also investigating the possibility of creating some circular off road routes for walkers, cyclists and riders. Our aim is to achieve these improvements or changes by working with the consent of, and in collaboration with our local landowners.

Thanks to the Parish Council and the No2 Party we now have a funding basis which, all being well, will enable us to seek other grants to start some repair work to broken and difficult stiles in the late spring/summer. We will contact landowners before carrying out any work. We also plan to draw up a small booklet suggesting circular walks and pub walks in the village pointing out things of interest along the way. **NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH
RELENTLESS DRIVE ON ACQUISITIVE CRIME WINTER 2012/13**

With the dark winter nights well and truly with us we're reminding people, particularly the elderly, to be on their guard against bogus callers. There have been a number of distraction burglaries this year in the Somerset area where unwanted or uninvited callers try to talk their way into homes and, while the owner isn't looking, steal money or property. There was an attempted distraction burglary in Wincanton on November 30. At around 2.30pm a man called at the home of a 92 year old woman. He said he needed to check the water pipes in the kitchen in preparation for a new kitchen to be fitted. Fortunately the warden noticed the unexpected caller and came across to ask him what he wanted. He told her that he was selling carpets before hurrying to a waiting vehicle which then sped off. We advise people always to check the ID of any callers and to ring the company they say they are from before letting them in. Genuine callers will not mind waiting. Our simple message to everyone is, if you're not sure then don't open the door.

Did you know there are more than 140 types of fraud being committed each year? It can involve a scam, a con, extortion, sham, double cross, ploy, ruse, confidence trick or other phrases and descriptions which refer to fraud offences. But the way in which you report fraud in Avon and Somerset has changed.

New arrangements came into effect from December 3 which means that most fraud is now reported to Action Fraud – the UK's national fraud reporting centre. Anyone wishing to report a fraud can contact Action Fraud by telephone (0300 123 2040) or through their website **www.actionfraud.police.uk**. The telephone lines are open between 8am-8pm (Mon-Fri) and between 9am- 5pm (Sat and Sun), while fraud can be reported round-the-clock via the website. Or else call the charity **Crimestoppers** anonymously on **0800 555 111 www.crimestoppers-uk** or **NHW co-ordinator (Cucklington)- Brian Trueman 01747 841014.**


