SEEKING JUSTICE IS 'ABSOLUTELY CENTRAL' TO CHRISTIAN FAITH

When Christians speak in public about community flourishing or about justice, there's always someone who will pop up and ask why we're sticking our noses in, as if these things were miles away from the proper concerns of Christianity.

Recently there have been the issues of money and credit unions and power costs of which the church has spoken. Stick to God, we are told. So we do, and we find Jesus saying: Love God, love neighbour.

The common good of the community and justice are absolutely central to what it means to be a Christian. They flow from the love of Jesus on the Cross, offering salvation, enabling justice and human freedom.

Loving God and loving our neighbour go together like the warp and the weft of a piece of fabric. They hold each other in place and together can be strong, and beautiful, and adaptable, for any number of uses.

But each without the other would be disconnected strands. When we weave them together in our life as people of God, we open up a range of possibilities that can make a real difference: Possibilities that can transform lives and transform communities.

That is our calling. We don't speak about common good and justice because we think we have some automatic right to be heard, but because loving our neighbour places responsibilities upon us.

We have responsibilities to act, to do what we can to make a difference, to work for our neighbour's flourishing, to bring justice. We have responsibilities to speak, even when it might be easier to stay quiet, to point to injustice and to challenge others to join us in righting it.

It shouldn't come as a surprise to anyone that the Church is part of the solution for building community blessing at local level – although I suspect that it might be questioned by some.

We need the imagination to see where we can do more. And we need to be rooted in that vision God has set out for us, of welfare and of justice. It is the common good and justice that transforms our communities.

FROM THE RECTORY

One of the best things about being a parish priest is the huge mixture of things I get to do. One of my favourites is leading the children's services, so a huge thank you to all the children who took part in any way in our Christmas services; you each made them very special to everyone who came: Thank you!!!

When you take children's services (in our group they are Growing Faith and Growing Together) you have to think very carefully about what you say because, unlike adults who will sit politely whatever they think of what you are saying, children will immediately see the problems and pick you up on them. Having to prepare for children's questions makes me ask children's questions, and the big one for me comes whenever the moral of whatever story I am telling or activity I am leading comes down to this; we must share with those around us. As I am saying this or something like this to the children and their attendant adults, I then ask myself "So when does it become alright not to share?". It obviously does become alright not to share at some point when you grow up, because it isn't something people do - share their houses, their cars, their money, their clothes. But I am not sure I would be able to explain to any child who asked me why grown-ups don't share. Sharing is in the bible, after all. When the crowds, with Jesus amongst them, came to listen to John the Baptist they asked him what God wanted them to do. John answered "Whoever has two tunics is to share with him who has none, and whoever has food is to do likewise". "Simples" as the Meerkat says. We find sharing simple when helping children play together but a bit too difficult for ourselves. Perhaps that's what Jesus meant when he said, whoever doesn't receive the kingdom of heaven like a child, will never enter it.

OUR VILLAGES

CHARITY BRIDGE EVENT

A Charity Bridge Event will be held in the Arthur Morison Memorial Hall, Cucklington in early-mid July 2014. Further details will appear in a later edition of Village News.

CUCKLINGTON

Fireworks: on Christmas Eve there were at least 2 sets of fireworks set off in the locality. Some of these were particularly explosive and disturbed grazing animals. Without dampening any celebrations we should remember that we live in an area with many animals, both domestic and agricultural. It would be courteous if anyone planning to set off fireworks outside the normal times, usually around 5th November, could let nearby properties with grazing animals know so that they can be prepared.

Litter Clearing: once again we would all like to thank those people who pick up litter as a matter of course. The effects of the recent weather would have been far worse if all the roadside litter had ended up blocking the drains.

There have been a couple of occasions when litter could be avoided. Some hard plastic packaging from a building contractor was dropped in the road and was broken up. If not picked up it would have ended up in the drains, potentially causing a blockage. The other event occurred when two cars had a “fender bender” on School Hill. They went off to exchange details but left the glass from 2 headlights and wing mirrors strewn across the road, presenting a serious risk to animals and car tyres. Both these events involved builders working on properties in Cucklington. It would be helpful if anyone contracting builders impresses upon them the need for tidiness and instructed them not to leave litter, not just at the specific work site but in the Parish as a whole.

Sand Bags: there is a limited supply of empty sandbags and the Emergency Committee is in the process of arranging to have a sandbag filler provided. Any flooding from the highway still needs to be reported to Somerset County Council Highways department. There is a supply of salt at the end of Babwell Road/School Hill junction and grit in the bin at the top of School Hill, above Babwell. If these need resupplying then contact Gordon Czapiewski (01963 32076), bearing in mind there will be a lead time.

Babwell Road: The effect of springs seeping water onto Babwell Road has been reported to Somerset County Council. I would suggest that anyone who has any concerns about this should also report this to SCC directly as the additional numbers of people reporting it, and any details provided, will assist the County Highways in assessing what action needs to be taken. At the moment there is an issue with the water seeping from Green Hill but also the drains in Babwell Road are not being as effective as they could be.
