FROM THE RECTORY

One of the most joyful events in nature's calendar for me is when the swallows return. You aren't thinking about them, you are out walking and your mind is on other things, when suddenly you catch sight of that familiar but half forgotten silhouette: they are back! One swallow certainly doesn't make a summer: in fact we know to our cost that whole flocks of swallows do not guarantee hot sunny summer weather but they do tell us that the short days of winter are behind us for another year. For the friends of Jesus who had followed him down from his home in Galilee in the north to his death on a Roman cross in Jerusalem, it was those tell-tale signs, much like the outline of a swallow on the wing, that told them what they could hardly take in, that Jesus, their crucified teacher, had indeed been raised from death as he said he would be. For Mary Magdelene, it was his voice, calling her name; for Clopas and his unnamed companion, it was the way Jesus blessed and shared the bread at the beginning of the evening meal, while for the fishermen who had come from Galilee, it was the re-enactment of the miracle that occurred when Jesus first called them from their fishing boats to be his students that convinced them: put the nets down on the other side of the boat, lads. Other people might not have noticed the voice, the phrase, the action but for those for whom it was intended it was enough to change their lives forever.

We don't get to see the Risen Lord but the thoughts and secrets of our hearts are like an open book to the God who knows us better than we do ourselves. One of Jesus' students, Thomas, issued a challenge, "unless I see the marks of the nails in his hands, unless I put my hand in the wound the spear made in his side, I will not believe". Jesus won't physically appear to us in response to our challenges to him, as he did to Thomas but if we have the eyes of our hearts open, we may notice the fleeting silhouette that speaks only to us. Every year, the churches in our area get together and invite the Bishop to come to hold a service of Confirmation at which people of all ages gather to reaffirm their baptism vows and be confirmed. Traditionally, this is the prelude to taking a full part in church life by becoming a regular participant in the service when we bless and share bread and wine together, as Jesus did the night before he died and which he commanded his followers to do ever after in his name. If any youngster from the age of 9 upwards, or adult is interested in being confirmed please let the Rector or a Church Warden know.
