Remembering Jesus now

We are in the season of 'remembering'. On November 1st and 2nd we celebrate the double feast of All Saints and All Souls with a particular focus on remembering our loved ones who have died. A few days later there is the opportunity, perhaps especially for children, to remember, remember the 5th of November and they will celebrate with bonfires and fireworks, probably not knowing why! Then, a week or so after that, the poppy takes centre stage as we remember those who have made the ultimate sacrifice and given their lives in the service of their country, with a particular poignancy this year as we mark the 100th anniversary of the beginning of World War 1.

But why do we remember? Is it not more important to put the past behind us and move on? Certainly there is a danger that our remembering becomes rather too focussed on the past, and that we become very nostalgic both about people and events and see them, as it were, through rose coloured glasses. But that isn't the way that people of faith are invited to remember. Each and every week, for those of us who come to church to break bread together, we are invited, in the words of Jesus to 'do this in remembrance of me'. This is not an invitation to go back in time and try and remember Jesus as he was. Rather it is an invitation to bring our memory of him into the present and in so doing to bring the love, the compassion and the forgiveness that was so much a part of his life into the way we live our lives. In other words, to make all that he meant to his disciples then real for us **now**.

A couple of verses from Lucy Whitmell's poem, 'Christ in Flanders', speaks into that reality for me especially in this anniversary year.

Now we remember; over here in Flanders —
(It isn't strange to think of You in Flanders)
The hideous warfare seems to make things clear.
We never thought about You much in England
But now that we are far away from England
We have no doubts; we know that You are here
Though we forgot You — You will not forget us
We feel so sure that You will not forget us
But stay with us until this dream is past
And so we ask for courage, strength, and pardon
Especially I think we ask for pardon —
And that you'll stand beside us to the last

From the Rectory

As November begins, the church celebrates, "All Saints Day". All the famous saints are remembered but it is also a day for remembering all those faithful people throughout the centuries, whose names are now forgotten, who also lived and died, walking the way of Jesus. The word "saint" conjures up pictures of people in stained glass windows, the apostles of Jesus, people killed for their faith in horrible ways or people in modern times like Mother Theresa who have done extraordinary things. What all these people have in common, as with all those saints whose names have not been passed on, is that they lived as if they, and the world in which they lived, belonged to God. That is what the world "saint" means "set apart". When we are baptized, all Christians are "set apart". In the days of the bible, if someone went to buy a sack of grain or a barrel of wine and didn't have a cart to take it away, the sack or the barrel would be marked with their seal, so it wouldn't be sold to anyone else before they had time to come back and collect it. In the baptism service, God seals a person, whether a baby, a child or an adult. The pouring of the water over the person or their immersion in the water is the outward and visible sign of God's inner seal. The "Saints" are those who manage to live out that reality, who see the different possibilities that are opened up when we recognize that the world and all that is in it are God's and we a part of it. Paul's letters in the New Testament tell us we are all called to be saints and it helps explain the real meaning of the word "Repent". It doesn't just mean be sorry for the things you have done wrong; it has a whole larger meaning: open your eyes and see the world and you yourself as you really are. Think again. The world is God's creation and God's gift and your life's meaning is found in that bigger picture. Saints aren't perfect people with lives and achievements that we cannot begin to match. The saints were and are people who take God at his word and each in their own way learn to live out what it means to be God's person in God's world.


