From the Organ Bench - November 2017

You learn something every day. For years I have played and sung the hymn best known as 'How great thou art', assuming that it was a translation from Russian. Indeed it is, but I learned recently, courtesy of Brian and Jill Trueman, that its origins were in Sweden.

Carl Gustav Boberg (1859-1940) was first a sailor, then a preacher and eventually a member of the Swedish parliament. This – 'O Store Gud' ('O great God') – is the only one of his hymns known outside Sweden. It was first translated into German, then into Russian, and finally into English by Stuart Hine (1899-1989), who was a missionary for the Plymouth Brethren working in Eastern Europe between the world wars. Apparently the view of the Carpathian mountains was the inspiration for the first lines:

O Lord my God, when I in awesome wonder Consider all the works thy hand has made....

and the 'woods and forest glades' that he wandered through were in Romania.

Stuart Hine seems to have written the first three verses in the 1930s, and the fourth just after the Second World War, perhaps inspired by refugees seeking their homeland.

When Christ shall come with shout of acclamation And take me home, what joy shall fill my heart; When I shall bow in humble adoration, And there proclaim 'My God, how great thou art'.

However great a hymn is, it needs a great tune to bring it to life. Right from its Swedish beginning, this one has had a terrific Swedish folk-tune to accompany it. Stuart Hine adapted it to suit his English translation, and words and tune, first made popular by the Billy Graham crusades of the 1950s, have been inseparable ever since.

Finally, an apology to the congregation at St. Lawrence's on behalf of people who lived long ago. It's no fault of yours or mine, but there are times when singers and organ aren't quite together when we sing hymns. The speed of the hymn isn't a factor, as it can happen with slower tunes as well. The problem is that the Victorian worthies who installed the organ elected to place it behind both arches and pillars, half-way into the vestry, so that the organist can't see, and can only faintly hear, what (or even if) the congregation are singing.

We are lucky to have some very good singing voices in the congregation, and one way to help would be for those with strong voices to sit further forward. But where you sit in church is a personal thing, and people must go where they're comfortable.

I'm a stamp collector and recently purchased a lot that included a few other items.

One of the 'other items' was a 1897 silver shilling in an envelope - on the envelope someone has

written

" this shilling was won by A.Suil (?) (Freem) at a victory fete at Stoke Trister after 1st World War. A tug of war between Bayford and Stoke Trister ladies. Won by Stoke Trister"

Clearly the provenance was not contemporary and must have been later than 1940s I'd suggest.

The coin isn't particularly valuable but might be of interest to someone from either village mentioned. I write wondering if it might be repatriated in some way?
