## From the Bishop

Looking ahead I am excited that the Archbishop of Canterbury is visiting our diocese for three days in November. I'm excited because he'll be praying with us, encouraging us in our new strategy to put mission and evangelism at the heart of everything we do, and encouraging us at parish level to be active in our local communities. The programme for 7<sup>th</sup> to 9<sup>th</sup> is still being finalised, but I am delighted he will be visiting all three archdeaconries, meeting farmers and overseas students, leading a prayer walk, speaking in several venues and hopefully experiencing and enjoying something of the scenery he will see as he travels among us.

I have had the privilege of meeting Archbishop Justin on a number of occasions and I am humbled and encouraged by his faith and commitment. Inevitably in just three days he will only get a snapshot of the Diocese, but I know that all who meet him or hear him speak will be moved by his deep personal commitment to Christ. It is clear that his relationship with Jesus and his life of prayer are at the very heart of all that he is and does. I look forward to his stay with us and the leadership that he offers to our Church and our nation and internationally in his daily ministry.

Encouraging others is part of the ministry of the Body of Christ and so this October can I encourage you to join in with Thank Your Vicar Week which is 16 – 23 October. We all respond well to appreciation and encouragement and whilst the work of our clergy often goes unnoticed I'm sure each one of us can think of a special moment when we've received something through the ministry of our clergy. This is the grace of God, working through the Holy Spirit and through his followers. We are all called to be followers, disciples of Christ, and we pray that through our lives and the lives of those around us that the Kingdom of Heaven comes closer and that God's love is known more clearly. #### From the Organ Bench – November 2016

21 October is known as Trafalgar Day, being the date of the Battle of Trafalgar in 1805. So it provides a good excuse, on the Sunday nearest to that date, to sing at the top of our voices the hymn beloved of seafarers (and especially the Royal Navy): *Eternal Father, strong to save*.

Young choristers delight to see that a hymn about the sea was written by someone called Whiting. William Whiting (1825-78) was what we would now call a 'one-hit wonder': *Eternal Father*' is the only hymn he wrote which became well-known, even in his lifetime.

Most of his life was spent as headmaster of the choir school at Winchester College. He seems to have had no connection with the sea apart from seaside holidays, and there is no known reason for his writing this hymn: let us just be glad that he did.

Although not a clergyman, Whiting was a good Biblical scholar, and *Eternal Father* has references to the creation of the waters in Genesis, to the storm at sea in Psalm 107 and to Jesus's miracles of calming the storm and walking on the water. The first three verses invoke the Father, Son and Holy Spirit in order, and the fourth, starting

O Trinity of love and power Our brethren shield in danger's hour: From rock and tempest, fire and foe Protect them wheresoe'er they go....

brings the Trinity together in prayer for the protection of seafarers.

To make a hymn a success invariably needs a strong tune which fits the words: and William Whiting was exceptionally well-served by the splendidly-named John Bacchus Dykes (1823-76) who was almost as prolific in his field as Whiting wasn't. He composed over 300 hymn-tunes, many of which we still sing today (for example the tunes to *Holy, Holy, Holy* and *The King of love*). *Melita* (the ancient name for Malta, where St. Paul landed after being shipwrecked) was written by Dykes for this hymn, which appeared in the first edition of Hymns Ancient and Modern in 1861. The editors made a few changes to the words, but unlike some modern hymn-book editors had the courtesy to agree them with Whiting first.

Words and music are a perfect match, especially loved by organists who can change some of the harmonies in the last verse to give an impression of the storm at sea. Dykes, perhaps knowing how *Eternal Father* would be used, had the good sense not to pitch the tune too high. I transpose many hymns down a key or two, but never need to with this one.

*Eternal Father* is rightly sung to great effect on many special ceremonial occasions, especially Naval ones: even sailors who think they can't sing will belt this one out. Both my parents were Naval officers, and it's one of my favourites too.

## **Bayford Hall**

Following the purchase of the Hall from the Church of England in April 2016, necessary repairs (primarily to the roof) were completed by the end of June 2016 and the task of conversion to a community facility has now started.

The focus has been to raise funds to complete this project whose estimated budget is £96k. A variety of methods have been used from the traditional grant applications to sponsorship of a half Iron Man, from a tabletop sale to a talk on Nepal. Viridor Credits have helped enormously in agreeing to cover around 50%. Parish, District and County Councils have agreed 20%, with the local community and businesses having given around 10%. This leaves a further 20% to complete the project.

There is confidence that the final 20% of funds can be raised and that conversion to a community facility will be achieved by the end of November. Its opening is planned for December. Information on how to book the Hall will be in the November edition of Village News.

The next fund raising event is the Bonhams Auctioneers Charity Valuations Day on 12th October in the Memorial Hall, Wincanton.
