

THE BISHOP OF BATH AND WELLS

The Bishop of Bath and Wells, the Right Reverend Peter Price, has announced he is to retire. Speaking at the Diocesan Synod held in Wells Cathedral on 3rd November he told the congregation: "In June of next year I will be into my 70th year and have proffered my resignation of the See of Bath and Wells as from June 30th 2013. I have had the privilege of serving this diocese as its bishop for nearly 11 years. It has been among the most special periods of my life and I thank you for all that you have been and done in support of that ministry."

FROM THE BISHOP OF TAUNTON

Sustain that hope – that stubborn thing inside

I was awake early this morning because I had left the radio on overnight to listen to the results of the American elections as they came in. I had vividly remembered the inauguration of the first African American President four years ago and I had been moved by the spirit of hope and promise that seemed to flood, not just across the United States, but across much of the world. 'Yes we can' was the cry and we all wanted to believe it!

And yet, four years on many political commentators from across the pond had seen that hope begin to ebb away and what they were discovering on the streets was less than hopeful as they contemplated an ever increasing national debt and the gap between rich and poor continues to increase.

Nevertheless Barak Obama has been re-elected as President and he continues to hope. 'Despite all the hardship we've been through; despite all the frustrations of government, I have never been more hopeful about our future and I ask you to sustain that hope. I am not talking about blind optimism, the kind of hope that ignores the challenges of the task ahead, or the roadblocks that stand in our path; I'm not talking about wishful idealism that allows us just to sit on the side-lines. I have always believed that hope is that stubborn thing inside us that insists that despite all the evidence to the contrary, something better waits us, so long as we have the courage to keep reaching and working.'

Those words take on a particular resonance for me as we prepare for the season of Advent, that time in the church's year when we look forward in hope to the coming of Christ among us, for despite all the evidence to the contrary I continue to believe in a God who longs for the well-being of humanity. Such was God's hope that he sent his own Son to live among us to show us how that hope -might be realised. Our hope is to be found in the one who laid down his life for us, who taught us what it means to love, who showed us the way of forgiveness and peace, who had the courage to live a life of integrity and truth. He is the one who gives meaning to it all and who invites us to do the same. As we light the first candles of Advent may be drawn once again in a commitment to live and work in hope for a better world in which the Kingdom values of justice and mercy, forgiveness and reconciliation reign supreme.


Giving Healing a Chance


FROM THE RECTORY

It's that time again! Love it or loathe it, Christmas is hard to escape. But behind all of the tinsel and the cheesy songs, what does it mean? In one sentence? Jesus is the answer to the question, if God were a human being, what sort of a person would God be? What would he say, what would he do? What would be his main purpose? Jesus' main purpose was to bring us "life in all its fullness". Christians claim that our complicated world is willed into being by God, perfect goodness and love. The world as we know it doesn't always look that way. It was Jesus' task to restore it, to bring healing and wholeness: to mend our relationship with God and to enable us to mend our relationships with one another; to help us live responsibly with one another on our planet and within our cosmos. That is all that the religious word salvation means: healing. Think of the old English word for a healing cream, a salve. Jesus' mission was, is to bring healing to body, mind and spirit, to individuals, to families and nations. Sometimes that healing comes in the dramatic inexplicable ways we call miracles, more often it comes through people's patient hard care but in both the loving healing touch of God can be seen and both grow out of prayer.

We can all pray wherever we are. God hears us and as we pray and offer ourselves to live out our prayers, we continue Jesus' work of healing. Learning to pray together for the world's healing is part of what the church is for. At every service we pray for the world and for our communities and for those whose needs have been brought to our attention. But every so often it is important to have services whose main theme is continuing Jesus' ministry of healing. That will be the theme of the last service of this year: Jesus, the healing light of the world. It will be a time to bring to Jesus those ways in which we, or those we care about, need healing in body, mind or spirit and to ask for his healing touch. We will use the symbol of the Christingle to help us reflect on Jesus gentle healing light shining into dark corners of shadow and pain. God's love again made flesh in us and through us.


We are pleased to hear that Maureen Parsons is recovering after her accident and that Beryl Griffin is out of hospital and wish them both well.
