Bishop's letter.....

.....The gift of prayer.



From Toby Wright, who will be installed as the Dean of Wells on Saturday 16th June

It is a great joy and privilege to come and join you here in Bath and Wells as the new Dean of Wells, to serve the Cathedral, the diocese and the county. This is an area with strong links on my maternal side, with my grandparents being married in Bath, and many relatives from around this patch.

One of the many things which drew me to this role is the privilege of prayer in your beautiful Cathedral Church. Each morning we gather and pray for the life of the diocese, and give thanks for that same life in the evening. Please be assured of my prayers for you in your mission and ministry and I warmly look forward to getting out to explore the diocese.

As I reflect on this time of change, I am mindful of the importance of finding patterns of prayer to sustain our lives, and nourish our spiritual growth. As Archbishop Desmond Tutu said many years ago, we must 'think of prayer as a relationship.' We are to invest in it, and to find space so that it can develop, and this takes time. Or as the mystic Evelyn Underhill put it, 'On every level of life, from housework to heights of prayer, in all judgement and efforts to get things done, hurry and impatience are sure marks of the amateur.'

We all know the importance of taking time to invest in relationships, and I love the challenge that hurry and impatience are sure marks of the amateur. As we reflect on our own prayer lives, I wonder if there are ways that we can deepen our relationship in prayer? The Christian tradition is packed with ways to help people learn to pray. Maybe we can find ways to slow ourselves down and be more present to the gift of prayer, so that we may join in the Apostle Paul's prayer, 'we have not ceased to pray for you, asking that you may be filled with the knowledge of God's will in all spiritual wisdom and understanding'. (Colossians 1.9)

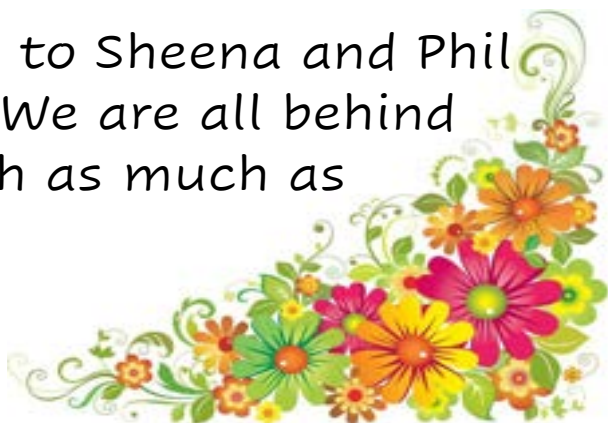

UDDER FARM



Hi 349 here, I have managed to get to the keyboard this month to let you know what has been happening.

To start with us girls are out day and night grazing nice fresh grass, it's a lot nicer being outside when the sun is shining, but not so good when we have a deluge of rain, when we all run to the hedge and huddle up together and make a muddy mess under the hedge. All the young ones are out as well dotted around the village, with some going off to foreign parts, namely Dorsetshire. We are not sure if

they will come back with a different dialect. Hopefully we will still be able to understand them.

Talking about going to Dorsetshire, we are as well, to graze during the day, you may have seen us on the left-hand side of the road as you go to Gillingham. They have carried out a major construction project and built a bridge across the stream at the bottom of our fields. They say it was major, but we think they are exaggerating a bit, as usual. What they did was manoeuvred an old lorry chassis from one bank to the other and placed old railway sleepers on top, this provides us with a safe way to cross the Parish and County boundary, they then put some safety rails along each side to make sure that we didn't fall off the edge. They also conned us by laying astro turf on top of the sleepers to make it looked like a continuation of the track that we normally walk down, it worked, and we all walked over it at the first attempt and came back from foreign parts to be milked that afternoon.

Also judging by the hours, they had disappeared on the tractors we are sure that they have managed to plough the field and work the soil to plant the maize seed that he was talking about last month. We can see over the wall in the yard and as we walk up to some of our grazing fields that the spring barley that was planted has germinated and the fields are getting greener by the day.

We herd them talking and know that the maize has been planted, because grumpy was telling the other one that he had just been past the field that the maize had been planted in, a week after it had been planted, and he could see the first pin like shoots of the maize poking through the soil. Now all we have got to hope for is that it comes up quickly and outgrows the weeds and we have a lot of hot sunny days to encourage it to grow and ripen. Hopefully if all the spring barley and maize grows well, we will have a more varied diet over the winter months than we have had over the recent years. It should also mean that the food miles, of the feed we eat will be reduced as it will be more homegrown. Which should mean that the amount of blend (muesli) and concentrates (cake) will be reduced.

Better get back to making milk now.

Want to be part of an Outstanding volunteer service? Then Route1 is looking for you!

Route1 Advocacy and Independent Visitors service supports children and young people who are in care or have a social worker. They do this by matching volunteers with young people as either short term Advocates, or longer term Independent Visitors.

The service recently had an independent internal review and was graded as Outstanding; and was shortlisted to the final 3 in the Frontline National Award 2024 'Team of the Year'

Route1 helps children have happy childhood memories, and ensures their views are listened to and acted upon.

Independent Visitors: These volunteers make a long term commitment to one child in care. They visit the child once or twice each month to build a trusting, supportive relationship and friendship that can sometimes last many years. This can bring life-changing experiences and opportunities to a the child or young person – and their Independent Visitor!

Advocates: volunteers work alongside individual children to ensure their voices are heard, and their wishes and feelings are taken into account when decisions are being made which affect them. Each child's support is usually short term and there is no expectation of a long term commitment to any particular child.

A recent trainee volunteer said "I started out thinking 'what on earth can require 5 days of training?' I now know why and think you have it just right."

Your life experience will be highly valued and you will be trained and supported in developing key skills. Your volunteering can be arranged to suit your availability.
