#### Bishop's letter.....

#### ...'It takes the whole world to know Christ

Bishop Michael Beasley, Bishop of Bath and Wells

Do you think a fish knows that it's swimming in water? I've been reflecting on this question not because it's some kind of Buddhist koan – the type of question that asks, 'What's the sound of one hand clapping?' Rather it's because I've been reflecting recently on questions of culture and world view. Do I see the world purely from the perspective of being who I am? (A 55-year-old white Englishman who grew up in a small village in the 1970s.) If that's the case, is what I see an accurate representation of the whole of reality? Might other perspectives be possible? If I could see the world through the eyes of others, might my vision be richer, wider, deeper? Like a fish that suddenly realizes that seeing can happen not only through water, but through air as well?

Seeing things from the perspective of others was something that Jesus did. An example of this happens when Jesus heals a centurion's servant in Luke's Gospel (Luke 7: 1-10). The centurion comes from a background and culture that's entirely different to that in which Jesus grew up. Yet Jesus is blown away by the insight that the centurion has about who Jesus himself is. This leads Jesus to exclaim 'I tell you, not even in Israel have I found such faith!'

The Diocese of Bath and Wells has a link with the five Anglican Dioceses of Zambia. There's much to be celebrated in the friendship that we share: the joy and vitality of the Zambian Church, the opportunities our link offers to help some of the world's poorest communities. But for me, the greatest gift we gain is the opportunity our link offers to stand in the shoes of others and to see the world, our faith, and the whole of reality



A wise person once said to me 'It takes the whole world to know Christ'. Our link with Zambia enables us to see more of the Jesus we share than we could ever hope to experience otherwise.

#### **Christmas Tree Festival 2024**

It's that time of year again where we ask you to start planning your Christmas tree entry into this year's Christmas Tree Festival (CTF).

The CTF will run from Friday 13th Dec through to Sunday 15th Dec at St Andrews Church, Stoke Trister. The CTF can normally accommodate up to 26 trees, and so far, we've managed to fill the church each year.

How you decorate your tree is entirely down to you... We've had trees entered that are covered in knitted crochet baubles, to trees dressed up as Darth Vader, to trees that have only a few decorations.

Please supply your own tree to decorate... Entries can use artificial or real trees (either is fine), albeit an artificial tree won't wilt. You can enter a small tree or a large tree, but it's best to keep the height to 6 foot as it becomes a challenge keeping it stood up.

Please use battery operated lights. We normally get there early to switch them all on and turn them off at the end of the day.

At the end of the festival (4.15pm on the 15th), you may take your tree home or leave it for a few days as the church will remain locked, then re-opened for collection.

## **UDDER FARM**



349 here again, I thought I would tell you what they have been doing during the summer, while we have been having our hols Well at the beginning of the summer (if that is the season we have just had) they made our winter feed, grass silage, they did manage to do this when it wasn't raining so it should be good stuff, we have started eating it already and it seems tasty.

Later on in July they harvested the spring barley they had grown to make us some whole crop silage, this is to balance out the grass silage as it is lower protein but hopefully higher in energy and starch, which helps us make nice rich milk with a high butter fat and protein content, to make really nice cheese, also the higher the quality of the milk (butter fat and protein) the more they get paid.

After this they did another cut of grass silage to make sure we have enough to eat till next spring.

Once the whole crop was done, they then had to reseed the fields where this was grown, they spent hours sitting on the tractor going up and down with various implements on the back of the tractor, we think that they stayed on the tractor so long, was because they were listening to the cricket on the radio. But looking over the gate it looks as if they made a good job of it and there looks to be a nice herbal ley growing, which we will look forward to eating next year.

In between doing all this field work they also pressure washed out the calf house, where our babies go to be reared as replacements for us, they also cleaned, washed and disinfected the calving pens, so that there are no nasty bugs to infect us or our babies.

At the end of September, they cut the maize and put this in the silage pit ready for us to eat with the grass silage over the winter months, the maize has the same attributes as the whole crop silage and gives us a change from just grass silage. We have started our winter lockdown early this year as it has become so wet, with all the rain we have had in the last month. At least we have some nice grub to eat over the winter, after all the hard work they put in to grow it for us. Now instead of being on a diet of just grass, we are now having a mix of grass silage, maize silage and a blend of other ingredients that is all put in the diet feeder (a great big food processor) and is then, when mixed put out into our feeders. So now we do not have to go out into the fields and look for some nice, tasty grass in the wet weather, it is brought to us on a plate. Happy days.
