Bishop's letter.....

...'Reimagining generosity''

Bishop Michael Beasley, Bishop of Bath and Wells



All is calm, all is bright' may not be the words that many of us would use to describe our experience of either the run up to Christmas or the feast itself. Presents to buy and wrap, food to order and cook, events and church services to be part of. And that's before we've negotiated the big day itself. I saw one website recently that claimed that Christmas is considered as one of the six most stressful life events, along with divorce, moving house and changing jobs! In the midst of such chaos, our churches offer an opportunity to find peace during this busy time – of stillness, quiet and the opportunity to stand back from all the pressures that the season contains. This year, the Church of England's theme for Advent and Christmas is Follow the Star: Calm and Bright. The theme draws on some of the lyrics of the famous carol, Silent Night: "Silent Night! Holy Night! All is calm, all is bright..." To be calm and bright is to be invited into the still centre of the Christmas story. It's to contemplate Mary holding the new-born Jesus, the Light of the World. It's to open ourselves to the joy of the angels as they tell the shepherds one? "Do not be afraid - Fear not!" It's to encounter the wonder of the wise men as they discover that the gift of this child is for the whole world. May your Christmas 2024 be 'Calm and Bright'!

The CTF will run from Friday 13th Dec through to Sunday 15th Dec at St Andrews Church, Stoke Trister. The CTF can normally accommodate up to 26 trees, and so far, we've managed to fill the church each year.

How you decorate your tree is entirely down to you... We've had trees entered that are covered in knitted crochet baubles, to trees dressed up as Darth Vader, to trees that have only a few decorations.

Please supply your own tree to decorate... Entries can use artificial or real trees (either is fine), albeit an artificial tree won't wilt. You can enter a small tree or a large tree, but it's best to keep the height to 6 foot as it becomes a challenge keeping it stood up.

Please use battery operated lights. We normally get there early to switch them all on and turn them off at the end of the day.

At the end of the festival (4.15pm on the 15th), you may take your tree home or leave it for a few days as the church will remain locked, then re-opened for collection.

- The proposed new name for the pub (drumroll please!)

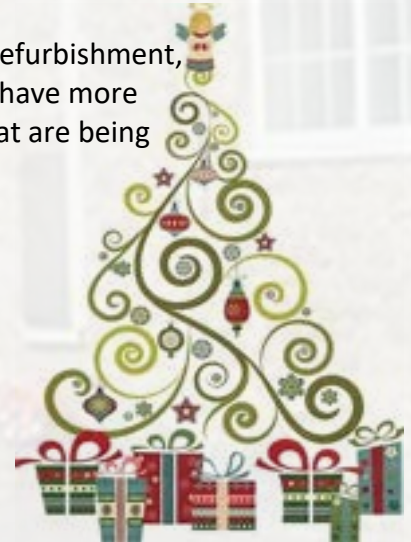
Plan A is to gather at the pub and stay there for the meeting.

UDDER FARM



Hi 349 here again! Last month I told you what they had been doing all summer to make sure we had enough to eat during the winter months. They did a good job and we have some lovely grub to eat this winter, not only does it keep us happy, but they are also pleased, because the better the quality of food they make for us, to eat in the winter, the more milk we are able to give.

Nearly all of us that calve in the autumn have now calved and the calf house is very full, so there will be a lot more little ones running around next summer. Now that we have all calved, the routine starts again...first the little stickers that they stick on our backs to show when we are in heat, we look like M.A.M.I.L (middle aged men in lycra) with fluorescent patches on our backs. Then out come the long plastic gloves and the A.I season starts.

Yesterday we knew something was up because the man that relief milks us on Fridays turned up to milk us. Yes, it was time for the six-monthly TB test. This is a very stressful time for us, and all concerned. When we have been milked we have to wait in a row outside the milking parlour, then one at a time they let us in to a cattle crush where we are held by our head, so the nasty man we haven't seen before shaves two patches of hair off our necks and then measures the thickness of our skin with a pair of callipers, after calling out our ear tag number to the person doing the clerical work who then shouts out the measurement which is recorded on an I-pad. Then to make matters worse he jabs us in the shaved area of our necks, these injections are two types of tuberculin, one made from killed M Bovis and the other killed Mycobacterium avium. Then four days later we must go through the same procedure without the shaving or jabs, but he measures our skin at the injection site and if there is an increased thickness where the bovine tuberculin was injected and this is over 4mm greater than the increase in the skin thickness where the avian tuberculin was injected, we will be identified as being infected with bTB. If this happens, we would have to be slaughtered, so as you can imagine this is a very stressful four days for us and them. Will let you know if I'm still here next instalment.

Hope you all have a HAPPY CHRISTMAS and eat a lot of British Food, especially CHEESE!
