It's sowing time!

It's sowing time! My greenhouse is currently full of seedlings pushing their way towards the light. Soon all this new life will be big enough to be planted out into the garden. Peas and courgettes, dahlias and zinnias; all ready to grow, blossom and be fruitful.

It's not only seedlings that grow. Churches do too! Just like all that's happening in my greenhouse, this doesn't happen by accident. Evidence shows that churches are most likely to grow when they plan and prepare for this to happen. Church growth is intentional.

This article of Manna contains stories about how churches in our Diocese have planned for growth and of the fruit they're seeing as a result. There's no 'one size fits all' for how this has happened. Just as in our gardens, what grows in one place won't necessarily thrive in another.

Important as planning and preparing may be, these things aren't the vital ingredient for growth. Growth comes when God is alive and at work within us and our churches. In his first letter to church he's helped establish in Corinth, St Paul also uses a gardening metaphor to describe the growth he's seeing. Paul says 'I planted, Apollos [Paul's co-worker] watered, but God gave the growth.' (1 Cor 3:6).

Without God's input, any plans we have to grow our churches will be little more than strategy, our efforts like those of ants running frantically to and fro. This is why our prayer for growth is essential. Prayer invites God to give us wisdom about what to do. It opens our treasure stores to resource the plans we want to put in place. It asks God to go before us to touch the hearts and minds of those we'd like to reach. It invites God to bless and prosper the work we do.

So be inspired! The accounts contained in this edition of Manna show what can happen when we ask God to grow our churches, offering God our prayer, our faith, our effort and our trust.

Let the sowing time begin!

The Bayford Inn Update

We held an open afternoon on Monday 21st April, to give interested parties an opportunity to have a look at the work done so far, and to chat about what's coming next. For those of you who weren't able to come, here's a summary.

The Bayford Inn

The overall plan (unchanged):

- Open as a wet pub with bar snacks on the ground floor, as soon as possible (perhaps June or July?)
- Create manager / tenant accommodation on the 2nd floor, to make management / tenancy much more attractive
- Create two good-quality en-suite inn rooms for overnight accommodation on the 1st floor, augmenting the income so as to be less reliant on bar takings
- Make the Bayford Inn a thriving community hub for generations to come!

What's happened since Christmas:

- Annexe refurbished, now generating a rental income, helping to offset costs
- Significant demolition works upstairs removing an incredibly steep staircase to the 2nd floor, removing very aged bathroom fittings (that had in a number of cases been leaking)
- Initial construction works upstairs new steel beams and a load bearing wall

What's going to be worked on over the next month or two (the critical path to initial opening):

- Replacing the front door and building an internal porch
- Finishing decoration of the bar area & toilets
- Installing a boiler for heating and hot water
- Fitting out the cellar and bar itself
- Putting up a sign!

On the financial side, the original share offer deadline has passed. This had been put in place as the point to make an overall decision of whether to continue or abandon the project.

The good news is that we have been making good progress towards the £350,000 target; almost £100,000 has been raised already - thank you to all of you who have already invested - so project Bayford Inn lives on!

The share offer will remain open until the funding target has been achieved; please do help to spread the word.


<u>Charlton Musgrove Short Mat</u> Bowls

REMINDER— CHARLTON MUSGROVE CHURCH ELECTORAL ROLL 2025

Our Church Electoral Roll is the register of voting members of Charlton Musgrove parish.

The preparation of a new roll involves all existing members who have to reapply and is an opportunity to encourage those new to church life, or to the community, to join the roll, as a practical symbol of commitment to the church. It allows us to take part in decisions which affect the church and parish, to take part in the Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM), and to stand for the Parochial Church Council.

Those eligible to be on the Roll are baptised residents in the parish aged 16 or over (or who will be 16 in the next 12 months) who are members of the Church of England (or of a Church in communion with the Church of England) OR baptised non-residents who have worshipped here regularly in the last 6 months.
