Transforming our communities through the love of Christ

In the early days of the Ukraine war, the Diocese of Hereford, where I was then serving, was approached by Herefordshire Council. They had been so impressed by the work of church members during the pandemic, who stepped up to support their communities in practical ways, that they asked if the diocese could take on organising homes for Ukrainians fleeing the war. Yes, of course, we said. And so began an ongoing partnership, where hundreds of Ukrainian guests have found homes in the Welsh Marches, and hundreds of tonnes of aid has gone across to Ukraine.

That's just what we do as the church, isn't it? We see a need in our communities and, motivated by Christ's love and teaching, we try to meet it. And we do it out of love, not seeking any reward. We are volunteers.

The word 'volunteer' comes from words meaning, 'of a person's free will.' Volunteers serve willingly. Freely. Out of love. So many in across our diocese serve our communities willingly, freely, out of love. We are deeply grateful. There are Foodbanks, lunch clubs, debt counselling services, mental health first aiders, bereavement cafes, after-school clubs, and youth drop-ins. That barely scratches the surface. All of this is done in the name of Jesus Christ, the one who came and gave himself for us willingly; freely; out of love. And it's transformational.

One of the areas of our common diocesan life which I'll be involved with is our work around Transforming Communities. There will be a lot more to be said in the coming months, but for now, I simply want to thank all our volunteers who serve willingly, freely, and out of love and say how much I'm looking forward to celebrating what we have, and building on it together, transforming our communities through the love of Christ.

All our volunteers have told us that this is not only a vital service for some members of the community but also extremely fulfilling and rewarding experience.

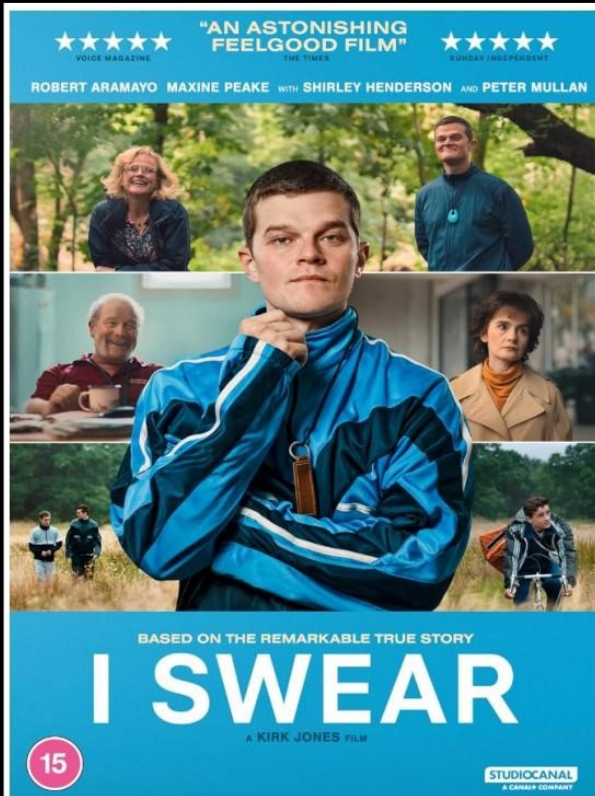

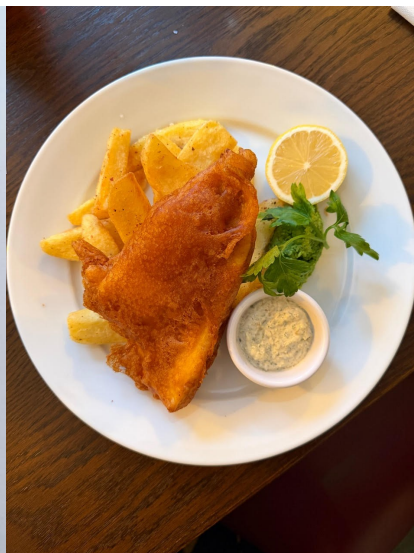

Stoke Trister (and Beyond) Book Exchange

Have you ever found yourself in a novel? A couple of days ago, as the wind attempted to blow our garden furniture into the next village and rain threatened, I found myself single-handedly wrestling a gigantic tarpaulin to protect the furniture. I thought of Gabriel Oak in *Far from the Madding Crowd*, selflessly battling the storm to save Bathsheba's hayricks while her feckless husband lay drunk in the barn.

My own husband was not drunk in a barn. He was upstairs playing the trumpet. This, while less feckless, is irritating when you are being slapped in the face by a wet tarpaulin and can hear only a cheerful "tootle-tootle" drifting from an upstairs window.

Bathsheba's husband, Sergeant Troy, is charming and physically attractive, but has no moral backbone whatsoever, being driven entirely by self-interest. The author's art is to let the reader see the real Troy while making sure Bathsheba can't (or won't). It's difficult to spot a villain in real life too.

In fairy tales it's easier; wicked witches at least look wicked. Not that this prevents characters from falling for it. Take Little Red Riding Hood, for example. The wolf's disguise of wearing her grandmother's hat clearly fooled her.

"I am not what I am," says Iago in *Othello*. At least he admitted it. Many characters operate on similar principles, but don't always tell us.

Good people can look bad (*Silas Marner*), and—more entertainingly for readers—bad people can look good. Becky Sharp, in *Vanity Fair*, deceives almost everyone she meets by being charming, apparently innocent, and saying and doing precisely the right thing at the right time.

It's all rather complicated. Perhaps writers are quietly suggesting that "deeds, not words" is the only reliable way of working out what anyone is really up to—though even then, as Becky Sharp demonstrates, deeds as well as words can be orchestrated for effect.

We don't live in novels, luckily. But our "Trumpet and Tarpaulin" chapter has a neat ending. As I write, my husband is up a ladder wrestling with a rose detached from the cottage wall in the wind. I'm inside, drinking tea, typing this, and looking forward to the next Coffee and Books Event.

It's on **June 10th, 10.30–12.00, at St Andrew's Church**. The last one was such fun—a chat and a laugh, really. Do come if you can.

We'd love to see you there.

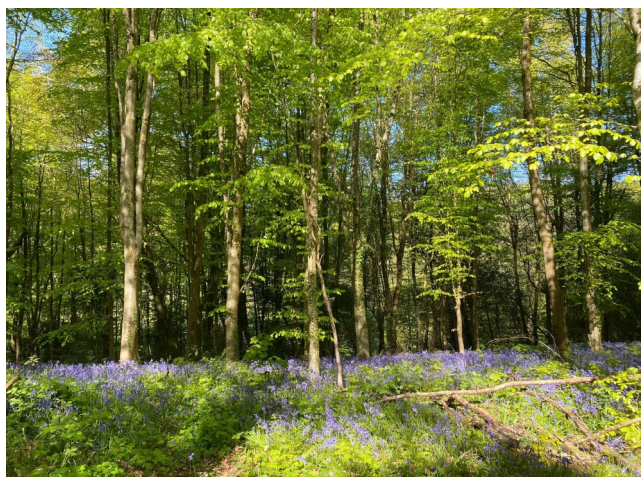
